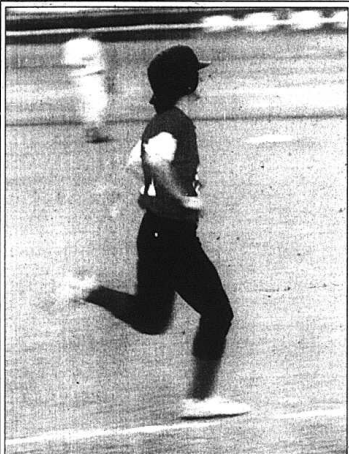

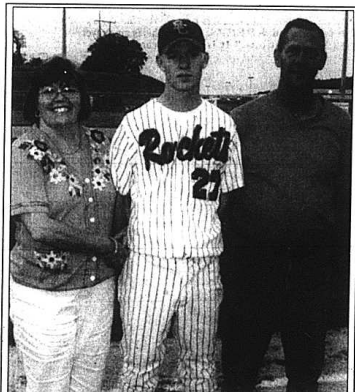

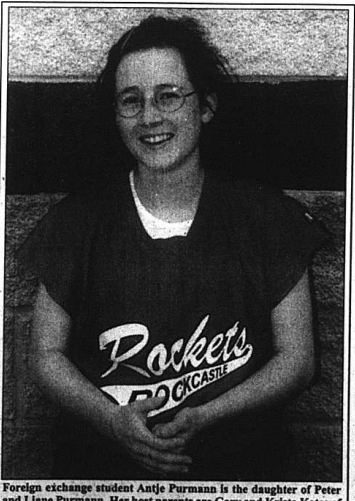
The Lady Rocket senior softball players and parents were recently honored during their last home softball game. Above, Brooke Roberts is the daughter of Glen and Donna Roberts.



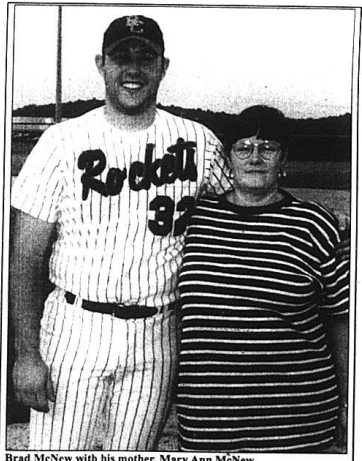

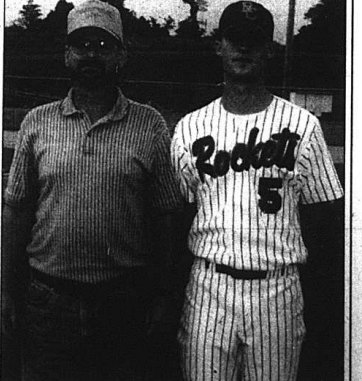
