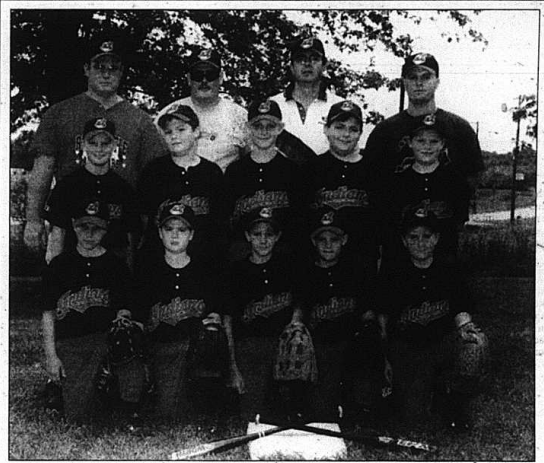
ceremonies, but also experienced new friendships, learned how to live cooperatively with others and experienced independence.

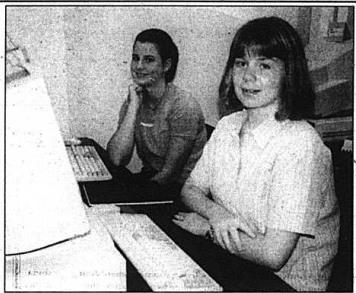


49 campers from Rockcastle County attended the J.M. Felner 4-H Camp in London the week of June 12-16.

Amy Elliott and Sarah Mullins attended Transylvania University's academic camp with computer emphasis for junior high students June 12-16. Participants learned about computers and basic programming, designed web pages and learned how to improve their performance on standardized tests.
