tobacco industry lied, defrauded, deceived, hurt and contributed to the deaths of millions of people over the last 50 years.

Joe Cerner, creator of Snokescraper, Ohio, said, "It is clear to me that most Americans do not want individuals plaintiffs to receive money resulting from punitive damages. I'm thinking of the McDonald's coffee incident, the GM car explosion, and other similar personal injuries. It's fine for plaintiffs to get compensatory damages (which was much less) to compensate them for their injuries, but not such large punitive damages. Punitive damages should hurt the defendants but not benefit the plaintiffs. Therefore, a better system would allow plaintiffs to receive compensatory damages, but not punitive damages. The Federal government to receive punitive damages. In the Engle case, plaintiffs would get compensatory damages for the injuries they suffered, but the Federal government would get the punitive damages which are intended to punish the tobacco industry for its conduct in a way that it will never repeat such conduct again."
