A "SMILE" won't cost you a cent, but to YOUR grandparents, it's worth a million.

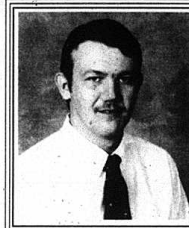
