and energy was created by having an opportunity to win a car.

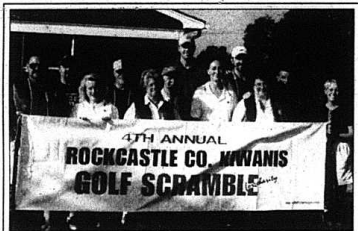
