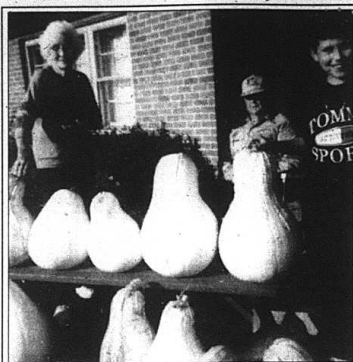
Dallas R. Clifford: Fines due (\$103.50), found guilty of contempt, 5 days in lieu of fine.

This is to give public notice that Highway Location Approval has been received for the following project:

Lincoln/Rockcastle Counties

Stanford to Mt. Vernon Road (US 150)

FD52-069-0150-010-016-04-D

FD52-069-0150-014-020-045-D

Item No. 8-244.50

This project will widen and realign a 13.5 mile section of US 150 from an area approximately 1.2 miles west of Crab Orchard in Lincoln County to the KY 461 intersection approximately 2 miles west of Mt. Vernon in Rockcastle County.

The Federal Highway Administration has approved a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) and Location Approval for this project on August 31, 2000.

Copies of plans, maps, relevant project data and FONSI are available for public inspection at the Department of Highways District Office in Somerset.
