NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY AMENDED ENVIRONMENTAL SURCHARGE TARIFF
PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on October 20, 2000 Kentucky Utilities Company ("KYU") will file with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") in Case No. 2000-439, an Application pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statutes 278.183 for approval of an amended compliance plan for purposes of recovering the costs of these new pollution control facilities through KYU's environmental surcharge. The total cost of these new facilities is estimated to be \$206 million.
The Federal Clean Air Act continues to impose new and additional requirements on KYU and other electric utilities. The United States Environmental Protection Agency has promulgated a series of regulations that require certain utilities, like KYU, to reduce nitrous oxide ("NOx") emissions to a level of 15 lbs. NOx/MMBtu by May 1, 2003. KYU will need to undertake these additional projects to reduce nitrous oxide emissions at its Gt. Bend, Brown Green River, Pineville and Tylene generating stations in order to comply with these new and additional environmental requirements.
KYU is also asking the Commission to approve proposed changes to its Electric Rate Schedule ES, effective for customer bills rendered on and after May 1, 2001. The proposed changes, if approved, will allow KYU to recover the incremental changes in the costs of Permit Fees associated with the pollution control projects approved by the Commission in this case and in Case No. 99-05 for cost recovery.
KYU is also requesting that an overall rate of return that includes a return on equity of 11.5 percent be used in the calculation of the environmental surcharge to recover the cost incurred for KYU's new compliance projects. Following the incorporation into base rates of the current surcharge amounts associated with existing compliance projects found to be just and reasonable by the Commission, KYU proposes to use the overall return for all going forward rate base amounts not included in base rates. The estimated impact on a residential customer using 10,000 kWh/month per month is expected to be an increase of \$1.23 per month for KYU customers in 2003.
The Application and Rate Schedule described in the Notice are proposed by KYU. However, the Public Service Commission may make an order modifying or denying KYU's Application or may order a Rate Schedule to be used that is different from KYU's proposed Rate Schedule. Such action may result in an environmental surcharge for consumers other than the environmental surcharge described in this Notice.
Any corporation, association, body politic or person may, by motion within thirty (30) days after publication or mailing of notice of the proposed environmental surcharge schedule, request leave to intervene in Case No. 2000-439. That motion shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission, 211 Sower Blvd., P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602 and shall set forth the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. Intervenor may obtain copies of the Application and testimony by contacting Kentucky Utilities Company at 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. Attention: Ronald L. Wilhite, Director Rates and Regulatory Affairs, Kentucky Utilities Company. A copy of the Application and testimony is available for public inspection at KYU's offices where bills are paid.
