\$45,000,000 FOR WAGON ROADS.

There is a bill introduced in Congress by the Hon. Walter B. Frank, of Tennessee, and the Hon. Jacob H. Gallinger, Senator from New Hampshire, appropriating \$45,000,000 out of the National Government for a national aid in building wagon roads. This bill is to be applied among the States according to their population, except that no State shall receive less than \$250,000. The State of Kentucky receiving this money must add like amount, so that \$500,000 will be expended in the building of wagon roads. This bill places in each State from 10 to 25 miles of hard road, which will not be affected by frost or spring rains and on which the farmer can haul the year round. It will be a great advantage to those living here, but it will be a great advantage to the whole country because it will be a wonderful object lesson; it will make everyone who sees this road and who sees it wide more ready just to do it, and it will come more ready just like it to be built.

RELIGIOUS

Rev. James Moore, the oldest minister of the Baptist church in the United States, died at his home in Birmingham, Ala., at the age of 97 years. He has been an ordained preacher for 70 years, and during that time has ministered to 1,731 people and baptized over 1,000 into the church. It is said of him that he has been a member of the Synod of the West for 70 years. The Rev. J. N. Prudridge, editor and publisher of the Baptist Appeal, an organ of the Baptist Church in Kentucky, has taken the initiative in bringing about a world's conference of Baptists, suggesting this idea in an editorial in the Argus a week ago. Dr. Prudridge's plan contemplates a gathering of Baptists from all over the world whenever the Baptist faith has gained a foothold, and he believes it will result in incalculable benefit to the Baptist Church on this continent. The gathering is to be held in the Pan Pacific Convention, and is to be held in London or New York, if that can be found, if that can be found.

NEWS ITEMS

Edward Clark is under arrest in Washington, Ill., charged with killing William Sewell, of Polk county, Ky. Jack Keefe, a motorman on the Lexington and Paris electric car line, was suddenly stricken dead and numb, and no cause can be assigned for it. Capt. Benjamin Cure Milam, a veteran of the Mexican War and the manufacturer of a noted fishing post, died at Frankfort. He was a shy two year old. Arrangements are said to have been completed for the construction of the in urban electric line between Lexington and Frankfort, by the way of Versailles. Lake Michigan has at last frozen and navigation is blocked. The average temperature for Dec. was 4.4 below normal and for January 4 below, which was only a fraction in 1904.

POLITICS AND POLITICIANS

Gov. Taylor took office as Secretary of War last Monday. "Boss" Tamm captured the Republican Congressional Committee in Louisville at the last meeting of that body and changed it, taking up from a Roosevelt organization to a Hanna organization. The Illinois B. D. proposing an educational qualification that would eliminate the illiterate negro voter, was virtually killed at Frankfort by the action of the House which indefinitely postponed action upon the measure. The term of the negro woman expired last week, and the President wanted to appoint her again, but she refused to accept it and he appointed another, Mrs. A. A. Democrat.
