SAFE LEFT UNLOCKED. Robbers Entered the Store and Carried Away \$1,000.

Middlesboro, Ky., Dec. 11.—The safe in the grocery store of Grealy & Son, in this place, was burglarized and nearly \$1,000 was taken. The robbery occurred at 7 o'clock.

WHILE RESISTING ARREST. Deputy Sheriff Holiday Shot and Killed by Jake Noble.

Lexington, Ky., Dec. 11.—In attempting to arrest Jake Noble at Jackson Gap, Holaday, a deputy sheriff, was shot and killed. Holaday had a warrant charging a misdemeanor and sought the aid of Noble's neighbors.

WITHOUT PROVOCATION. An L. & N. Section Hand Killed by Brakeman, It is Alleged.

Beattyville, Ky., Dec. 11.—William Newman, brakeman on the L. & N. railroad, was killed here. James P. Jones, a section hand, is accused of the crime.

Plan Important Changes. Shelbyville, Ky., Dec. 11.—The state committee on revenue and taxation has been in session here all week preparing the new revenue bill for the next general assembly.

Securing the Right of Way. Lexington, Ky., Dec. 11.—The Central Kentucky Natural Gas Co., which proposes to furnish all of the Central Kentucky towns with natural gas from the wells of Menifee county, has secured the right of way from J. F. King, the gas fields, with the exception of a small tract of land near Winchester.

Wants Accused Name. Lexington, Ky., Dec. 11.—As it is his duty to disclose the name of the person who shot and killed the sheriff, the next session of the Rockcastle grand assembly probably will disclose his name, but so far he has declined on a cotnamer.

Murder and Beheading. Newport, Ky., Dec. 11.—Coroner William H. Hines said he will return verdict of murder and suicide in the case of Robert Mader, 23, and his young wife, Lizzie Mader, 17, of McMurre, Campbell county, Ky., who were executed here last Saturday.

Healthy Triplet Born. Corinth, Ky., Dec. 11.—The infant of Henry Woodson, who was born with triplets, two boys and a girl, to Dr. R. H. Landon, of New Concord, Ky., on Dec. 10, weighed 10 pounds, and the children were born.

Married Half a Century. Covington, Ky., Dec. 11.—J. Fred Rothenbush and his wife, Jane, celebrated the golden anniversary of their marriage with a family reunion in their home, 24 East Nicholas street. Dr. Rothenbush is 73 years of age and his wife is 75.

Killed in a Shooting Gallery. Poinsett, Ky., Dec. 11.—Paul Bowles, aged 28 years, died at the Huddle establishment in this city as the result of a shot wound received at the hands of C. W. Poston, proprietor of a shooting gallery on Main street, in a quarrel.

Not Out February. Covington, Ky., Dec. 11.—The Secretary of the Treasury John G. Carlisle has notified his relatives and friends that he will not bring his remains to this city for Covington for interment until the last of January or first of February.

Congressman Rhinock Operated On. Louisville, Ky., Dec. 11.—Congressman Rhinock of Cornington, Ky., who is recovering at the Imperial, had two operations performed on his throat and neck last Friday by Dr. Quinlan, of this city, which were entirely successful.

A Verdict For \$400. Lancaster, Ky., Dec. 11.—Representative J. R. Mount was awarded a verdict of \$400 against the L. & N. for injuries sustained while alighting from a train at this place about a year ago. He sued for \$10,000.

Tobacco Factory Fires. Sikeston, Ky., Dec. 11.—The tobacco factory owned by James Chestnut, at Sikeston, was destroyed by fire. The John Russell factory was damaged. Incendiarism is suspected.

SAVED BY THE POLICE.

Nathaniel Sharp Had a Close Call at Lexington.

Lexington, Ky., Dec. 12.—Nathaniel Sharp, claiming to be a resident of Richmond, Ky., was arrested here charged with detaining Misses Susan and Katie Ray against their will. Much excitement prevailed in the southern part of the city, where the young women live, and had it not been for the officers Sharp would have been severely dealt with.

CAUSED A SURPRISE. James A. Todd Named As Assistant Postmaster.

Lexington, Ky., Dec. 12.—Postmaster Charles H. Berryman announced this appointment of James A. Todd as assistant postmaster to succeed Geo. R. Warren, who has held the place since the retirement of Thomas L. Walker two years ago.

THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE.

THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER.

Recommends the Abolishment of 107 Local Land Offices of Receivers of Public Moneys.

Washington, Dec. 12.—In his annual report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1905, the commissioner of the general land office recommends that the office of receiver of public moneys in the 107 local land offices be abolished.

During the year 1,765,822 acres of the public land was disposed of. The receipts from all sources aggregated \$7,017,411, and aggregate expenditures and estimated liabilities for the public land service \$1,150,000.

In regard to the alleged unlawful inclosures of public lands, fraudulent entries and illegal cutting of timber on the public domain, the report states that during the year nearly 1,500 entries were suspended and 1,000 entries were cancelled as a result of 7,000 cases reported.

IN THE BALTIC PROVINCES.

Desecration of Churches, Murder of Land Owners and Pillaging.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 10.—By a dispatch from St. Petersburg, Dec. 10, it is completely out of the mind of the revolutionaries. Even the railway telegraph is not working. The scanty news reaching St. Petersburg is all bad news.

RUSSIAN REFUGEES.

Five Hundred of Them Arrive at New York City.

New York, Dec. 12.—Five hundred Russian refugees, many of them eye-witnesses of the massacres and other atrocities and other Russian cities, disembarked here from the steamer Patria and Chemnitz.

DEATH LIST ON THE LAKES.

A Total of 215 Lives Lost During the Past Season.

Chicago, Dec. 11.—According to figures compiled by the Lake Michigan News Bureau the death toll on the great lakes during the season now closing has been the heaviest of any year since big steel vessels began to be used on the lakes.

Anticipate Interest.

Washington, Dec. 11.—The secretary of the treasury announced that he has authorized the payment of the interest on the United States government bonds due January 1, 1906.

The Frigate Constitution.

Annapolis, Md., Dec. 12.—City council passed unanimously a resolution petitioning congress not to authorize the desecration of the old frigate Constitution, but to have it brought to Annapolis and kept at the naval academy.

The Week's Business Failures.

New York, Dec. 9.—Business failures for the week ended December 7 numbered 303, against 184 last week. 251 in the like week of 1904, 241 in 1903 and 247 in 1902.

WENT TO THE GALLOW'S BRAVELY

To All Appearances the Woman Was the Calmest Person in the Death Chamber.

Her Neck Was Broken at the Second Cervical Vertebra and the Lost Consciousness Instantly the Drop Fell.

Windsor, Vt., Dec. 9.—Without a sentence without a word, Mrs. Mary Mabel Rogers marched to her death on the gallows at the state prison here and paid the penalty of murdering her husband, Marcus Rogers, at Ferrisburgh on August 13, 1902. To all appearances Mrs. Rogers was the calmest person in the chamber of death. She faced her end with the same stolid indifference that had marked her conduct ever since her arrest.
