THE PUBLIC SCHOOL THE ONLY SECURITY FOR THE FUTURE.

At the Fourth meeting of the "Conference for Education in the South" held at Winston-Salem North Carolina, in 1905, the following resolutions were adopted: "The Conference for Education in the South" reaffirms its conviction that the overshadowing and supreme public need of our time, as we pass the threshold of the new century, is the education of the children of all the people. We declare such education to be the foremost task of our statesmanship and the most worthy object of Philanthropy. With the expansion of our population and growth of industry and economic resources, we recognize in a fitting and universal education and training for the home, for the farm and for the workshop, and for the exercise of the duties of citizenship, the only salvation of our American standards of family and social life and the only hope for the perpetuity of our institutions founded by our forefathers on the four cornerstones of intelligence, virtue, economy, efficiency and capacity for political self control. We recognize the value of efforts hitherto made to solve our educational problems, both as respects the methods to be used and also as regards the sheer quantity of the work to be done. We also recognize in the facts as represented at the session of this Conference, the imperative need of renewed efforts on a larger scale, and we also find in the improved financial outlook of the country and in the advanced state of public opinion, better hopes than ever before, of a large response to this great need. As the first step toward such a response, we urge elementary instruction, and as this instruction shall come to the children largely through mothers and women teachers in their homes and primary schools. We desire to emphasize our belief in the wisdom of making the most efficient use possible for the education of girls and women. This Conference will meet in Lexington May 23 and 4, 1906.

The two beds rows of the first bed should be planted with a second early pea, such as Heroine or Dwarf Telephone and outside two with an extra early, such as Motts Explorer, as this arrangement enables you to raise first ready to be picked without disturbing the roots. Two good rows should be sown in the second bed, and second filling the outside rows, while the rest of the bed is left vacant.

This mode of procedure furnishes two beds five feet long and one of fifteen which are available for climbing plants, with a permanent walk around the garden giving access to the alley on both sides. between them a shallow trench a foot wide to serve as a sowing path, and as a drain for carrying off the surface water, an outlet being provided for this alongside either or both the longitudinal walks as circumstances may require. These beds should be neatly rounded up with soil taken from the intervening spaces and as soon as dug, thoroughly raked and smoothed. They will then furnish an admirable seed bed that should be almost free from seeds, the undersoil of which their surface is composed, not having been exposed to impregnation.
