The action of Governor Beckham in the closing of saloons in the cities has been the occasion of much comment and his action in this matter has to a certain extent been successful in accomplishing the end sought—the indorsement of a few of the temperance people of a few States in his race for United States Senate. We belong to the temperance league ourselves, but we don't belong to the kind of temperance that Gov. John Crisp Wickliff Beckham is trying to poke down the throats of the good honest people. Yes, we say close the saloons on Sunday and every other day in the week, but the spirit which prompts such action, should count as much or more than the act itself. For six years the Governor has had the power to enforce the Sunday closing law, the law has never been changed, the same law to day that it was six years ago and what is good for the people to day would have been just as good six years ago. It is a farce, a shrewd plan which the Governor has devised to get the indorsement of the temperance people. After Nov. 6th, there will be no further orders from the Governor and every saloon in the city of Louisville will be as wide open as a hop-jack. Marking prediction and see if we are not right. The following, which appeared in a recent issue of the Danville News, so correctly describes the situation that we copy it in full: "After all his vowed devotion to the cause of temperance and the enforcement of the law, after trying over the State declaring himself a reformer, being introduced at his speakings by deluded preachmen and receiving flowers from the delegations of the Women's Temperance Union, after declaring that he would enforce the Sunday closing law in Louisville if he had to call out the militia or convene the Legislature, after all of this buncombe and demagoguery, J. C. W. Beckham, the "Reformer" Governor of Kentucky, has indignantly made terms with the whisky party. A Louisville paper is authority for the statement that for two Sundays liquor has been sold openly in that city and that Governor Beckham has made terms with the saloonmen and will no longer attempt to enforce the law. It says that the saloon men who have been so obnoxious to him are now—led in his praise. Did it ever occur to you that Governor Beckham never intended to enforce the law, but was using the Sunday closing law as a whip to drive the saloonmen to his support and to make an agreement from them to stand the city of Louisville for him or to be driven out? We have it from a reliable source that there is an organization in Lexington of Beckham men who will stuff the ballot boxes in that city to give Beckham a large majority. Our authority for this is as good as could be had, unless it would be one of the conspirators. What is true of Lexington will be true of all the other large cities in the State where the "machines" can get in their work. There is no question in our mind that McGreevy will carry the state by a majority. The only thing that it will not have ever feared is that it will not be counted as cast. Give McGreevy a fair count and he will win by forty thousand. His only fear must be to see that every vote that is cast for him shall be counted."

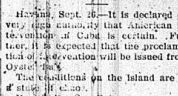

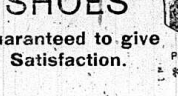
