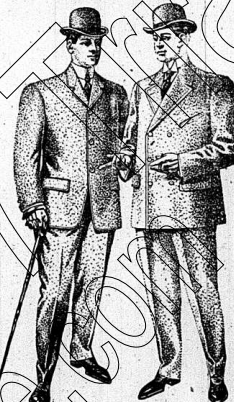

RENT PAYS FOR THE LAND.

FERTILE SECTIONS OF THE SOUTHWEST, WHERE LAND SELLS FOR \$15 AND RENTS FOR \$5 PER ACRE.

One of the remarkable things about Eastern Arkansas and Northern Louisiana is the fact that certain rents for \$5 per acre cash and can be bought for \$2.00, \$15 per acre. It costs \$6 to \$10 an acre to clear it. Other improvements are slight and inexpensive.
