### CALL.

We, the Republican Committee of Rockcastle county, Kentucky pursuant to the authority vested in us as such Committee, and not being assembled in Committee meeting duly called for the purpose of devising ways and means of nominating Republican candidates for the various offices in said county to be voted for at the regular November election, 1909, a regular being present and having, do hereby resolve, order and direct that a primary election be had and the same now hereby called, to be held in said county on the 15 day of May, 1909, for the purpose of nominating Republican candidates for County Judge, County Attorney, Circuit Court Clerk, County Court Clerk, County Superintendent of Schools, Sheriff, Assessor, Surveyor, Jailor, Coroner, and one Magistrate for each of the five Magistrate Districts of said county, and one Constable for each of said Magistrate Districts, to be voted for at the regular November election, 1909, and we offer said candidates to be named in each of the regular voting precincts on said date, to be held on the 15th day of May, 1909, at the hours of 9 a. m. and 4 p. m. for the purpose of making the nominations aforesaid.

Resolve that the following rules be and they are now and hereby adopted for the government of this Committee in holding said primary election:

1. That the cost of holding said primary election shall be borne by the candidates for nomination at said election, and shall be divided as follows: \$40.00 is assessed by this Committee against the candidate for the above offices, except Assessor, which is \$20.00, and Surveyor, Coroner, Magistrates and Constables, which is \$10.00 for

each candidate, and the said amounts shall be paid to A. G. Lovell, Secretary of this Committee not later than 12 o'clock noon on the 30th day of April, 1909.

That this Committee shall meet by the court house of this county at one o'clock p. m. on the 5th day of May, 1909, and shall there appoint suitable and qualified persons to act as officers of election of said primary for each voting precinct in this county, and that each candidate shall have the right to furnish this Committee with a list of names of suitable and qualified Republicans to act as election officers, and if the candidates submit such list, election officers shall be named from them, dividing them as nearly equal between the respective candidates as can be done.

The election returns shall be deposited with the Secretary of this Committee who meet on the 10th day of May, 1909, and after being first duly sworn, as required by law, shall canvass and count the returns of said primary election and shall issue certificates of nomination to the candidates receiving the highest number of votes in the county, and shall properly certify their names and nominations to the County Court Clerk of said county requesting and directing that their names be printed on the official ballot to be used at the regular November election, 1909, in the Republican column under the device of the Republican party, to wit: a Big S. R. for the office named in said certificate.

4. In case only one candidate for any of said offices meets the requirements of this call not later than 12 o'clock noon on the 30th day of April, 1909, this primary election shall not be held as to said candidate, or candidates, but this Committee shall meet at the court house of this county, to be held on the 5th day of May, 1909, and shall declare said candidate or candidates to be the nominee of the Republican party, to be voted for at the regular election, 1909, for the office or offices, and shall certify his or their names to the County Court Clerk, as was provided in this call. Each candidate meeting the requirements of this call shall have his name printed upon the ballots to be used at said primary election.
