A war is being made on unlicensed dogs at Frankfort. Rain has done immense damage to crops in Nicholas county and vicinity. The Democratic City Committee of Henderson has determined not to draw party lines in the coming municipal election.

The residence of Edward A. Neff, at Claysville, Shelby county, was destroyed by fire. The loss is \$3,000.

While operating a threshing machine at Salmon, Simpson county, Robert McBride was struck by a belt and badly injured.

Miss Mary Agnes Durham, aged sixteen years, of Casey county, died in a Lexington hospital after undergoing a surgical operation. The bodies of Otto Hoffman, Hanson Ryan and William Fleming who were drowned in the Ohio river near Ft. Thomas have been recovered.

Dr. Ben L. Bruner, Secretary of State, moved into the Capitol Tuesday, being the first State officer to take quarters in the new building.

Bliciot, the France aviator, crossed the English Channel in his monoplane in less than half an hour, this being twice the speed of the fastest mail boats.

Elizabethtown is making a determined effort to secure the location of the Old Mason's Home, if moved from Shelbyville. Over \$3,000 has been subscribed.

Ray Hays, 22 years old, shot his uncle, Jeff Sanders, in Graves county, as the result of quarrels over the division of a crop. Sanderson died a few hours after he was shot.

The new Persia Government is prepared to offer Mohammed Ali Mirza, the ex-Shah of Persia, an annual pension of \$25,000 on condition that he leaves Persia without delay.

The Moors gathering in the Rif region, and it is said that a force estimated at 20,000 is preparing to make an attack on the Spanish troops, who number only 8,000.

The seventeenth world conference of the Young Men's Christian Association is being held at Barmer, Siberfeld, Germany, from Wednesday until next Monday.

Arrangements are being perfected for the annual reunion of Gen. John H. Morgan's men, which will be held on the Chattanooga grounds at Perks Hill, Nicholas county, on August 17 and 18.
