OWENSBORO, KY., MARCH 11.—(Special).—The Owensboro Messenger will say in the morning: "The Hon. Angusway Stanley, Representative in Congress from the Second district, will make the race for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination. A statement to that effect will be issued to-morrow by Mr. Stanley at his home in Henderson. The decision being reached after consulting with his friends from every county in the district for the past three days."

"Mr. Stanley is declining to make the race, after the earnest solicitation of friends in every part of the State, will declare that he has recently been elected to Congress by the Democrats of the Second district. During the campaign for the nomination, Mr. Stanley was charged by his opponents with being a candidate for Governor and the Governor in a same time. He made the race as a candidate for Governor and said that he would not be a candidate unless the people called upon him to make the race."

CONFERS WITH FRIENDS.

"To day he met with the Democratic county committee men from every county in the district. The prevailing opinion of the committee was that the party of the State faces a very grave crisis and that some strong man upon whom all the Democrats could unite should be the party nominee."

"At the conclusion of the conference Mr. Stanley made a statement which he said: "There is one thing you cannot sacrifice, even for the benefit of your party or your home or anything else, and that is your solemnly pledged trust to the people who elected you, and I must be true to the pledge made to the people of the Second district. I will obey their will, as I am their servant, and will take this matter under due consideration and give my answer on Monday."

TALKS WITH CONSTITUENTS

"It is known that Mr. Stanley has talked to scores of his former constituents over this district during the past few days and that a majority of them have urged him to remain in Congress, many of them having the opinion that the office of Representative in Congress is the one that of being Governor of Kentucky. Then, too, several Democrats of the district have announced their intention of becoming candidates to succeed Mr. Stanley in the event of his going to Frankfort, and it is charged by some of his friends that there is a plan to get him out of the way so some other man can go to Frankfort."

"Mr. Stanley's arrival in Louisville he was given assurance that he could make a winning race for Governor, but he declined to make any announcement of his candidacy, saying he wished to consult the people of the Second district. During the past few days it seems that someone has worked up a rather strong opposition to Mr. Stanley's entering the race, but whether it was the result of the work of friends of the other

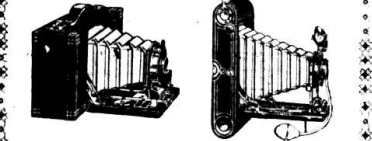

THE VIRTUES OF ST. PATRICK.

Most of the European nationalities represented in this country have their patron saints whose festival days are more or less observed. The Englishman, for example, St. George's Day at all, usually contemplates himself with vesting a rose. The Welshman and Scotchman honor the memory of St. David and St. Andrew with banners, and with songs and speech in which the glories of Cambria and "Auld Scotia" are extolled. But of all days St. Patrick's is most generally observed. Shamrocks and green ribbons are everywhere in evidence and eloquent speakers vividly describe the virtues of the saint.

After divesting the story of St. Patrick of the legends that have accumulated, enough remains to prove that he was deserving of all the honor that has been paid him. Unblemished in character, able and learned, fearless in preaching, faithful and courageous in his mission, and remarkably successful in winning men to the Christian faith, it is but natural that he should be enshrined in the heart and memory of a grateful people.

But apart from the tribute paid to his merits it is probably that one great cause for the honor shows his natal day is found in the cheerful character of Ireland's history. Centuries of oppression have naturally caused the Irish to treasure the memory of their heroes

and saints, and to display a passionate love for their land which no distance of time or space can lessen.

Happily the period of oppression is nearly over. England understands and appreciates Ireland as never before. Thanks to the better knowledge and increased political power of the masses, and is eventually bent on wiping out the wrongs that Ireland has suffered. There is now the state church was disestablished. Thereby at one blow destroying our great injustice and lessening religious animosity. A large reform in the land laws has been accomplished; a national university endowed, millions of dollars provided to enable the peasants to build decent homes, and home rule is measurably nearer than it was when Parnell died. All this reminds us of the poet's inspiring lines:

"Hail O Erin! thy winter is past, And the hope that lived through it shall blossom at last."

Every well wisher of Ireland must rejoice in seeing the old restrictions and estrangements given way to liberty, right dealing and the manifest desire of the English people to atone for the past. It will give an added zest to the observance of St. Patrick's Day.

Robert Emmet never uttered a truer word than when he said: "The spirit of a nation never dies." True as this is of all nations it is especially so of the Irish, who through all the centuries have proven through storm and calm, though zeal and woe their devotion to the Emerald Isle. Also they have always cherished the memory of those who at home or in exile have suffered for their fidelity to the cause of Ireland. In all this they have abundantly proven the correctness of Emmet's immortal words.

POLITICS AND POLITICIANS

Owensboro Inquirer: The politicians tried every way imaginable to push Stanley into the Governor's race, while the farmers held a tight grip on his coat tails, saying, "Don't do it, Owsley." Now that he has yielded to the wishes of the farmers, it may be that he has made a wise decision.

Owensboro Messenger: Politics occupies the center of the stage today, for a great campaign is on. But let it not be forgotten that one of the most issues of the campaign is the question of an intelligent and modern system of taxation. The politician may overlook the fact, but Kentucky does not.

Danville Advocate: The Hon. Owsley Stanley has finally made up his mind that he does not want to be a candidate for the gubernatorial Democratic nomination just at this time, thus leaving the situation as it has been for the past several weeks. Whether the be-

Lexington Herald: Candidates for the Legislature should be required to express their definite views before nominating and election. A new Legislature is to be elected this fall. The best service newspaper men of the State can render is to keep these subjects so prominently before the people that every candidate for the Legislature shall be required to make his views known before election.
