CAMPAIGN CLOSÉS

WAŠ WELL ATTENDED BY MEMBERS FROM ALL OVER COUNTRY.

Was Sans, National Movement to Put Christian Activity on a More Permanent and Efficient Basis.

The Men and Religion Forward movement, composed of Louisville men with a mass meeting at the First Christian Church, Fourth and Breckinridge streets, attended by nearly 100 men and boys, at which the leaders told of the work of the organization along different lines in short addresses. A delegation of several hundred workers from New Albany entered the church just as the exercises began and occupied a section that had been reserved for them. They marched to the street from the intersection station to the music of a band. The speakers were: Dr. D. M. Drane, the Rev. David D. Drum, the Rev. Clarence A. Barbour, the Rev. John L. Alexander, the Rev. William A. Hays, the Rev. Charles D. Dumm, the Rev. David Lambuth, the Rev. Dr. J. J. Lansing and the Rev. David Russell.

The Rev. Dr. Barbour explained that the Men and Religion Forward movement is not an office movement, more to the already large number of organizations and societies of the Christian church. The executive committee, which directs its activities, he said, will go out of existence next May, when the organization will come to an end.

"It is not so much an organization or society," said Dr. Barbour, "but a movement. It is an organization of men to put Christian activity on a higher, more permanent and more efficient basis. As a movement it will live, as an organization it will cease to live. It is based on a foundation of inquiry into facts. As a slogan it can be said, 'sovereign and before the conditions that we must fight.'"

WANT RECALL SYSTEM.

Commission Government Men Will Ask Statute Amendment.

Lexington.—Attorney Bailey D. Berry, one of the leaders in the campaign for the adoption of the commission form of government in this city, stated that Lexington would cooperate with Newport and other cities in the effort which desire commission government in urging the passage of an act by the legislature which would feature in the statute providing for commission government. The recall in one of the most important features of commission government in cities outside of Kentucky, provides for the dismissal of officials from office when their acts are objectionable to a majority of the voters. When the statute providing for commission government for cities of the second class in Kentucky was passed, the recall feature was omitted on the ground that it would be contrary to the constitution of Kentucky, which provides that an official can not be removed during his term of office. Further consideration of the question, however, it is said by the friends of commission government that lawyers are now convinced that this clause would not be unconstitutional and an effort will be made to have it inserted by the legislature this winter. The commission plan is already in operation in Newport, and was adopted for this city at the recent election. Mr. Berry states that the initiative will probably be taken by Newport in asking for the insertion of the recall feature, and would be heartily supported by the friends of commission government in this city.

HYDROPHOBIA CAUSES DEATH.

No Indications For Eight Weeks After Bite.

Haverhill.—Bud Grimes, "a ten-foot colored boy, died under mysterious circumstances on a winter day a few hours. A Very Good Law.
The Virginia law under which reporters and barred from writing any publication of persons convicted of suffering from insanity, is not to be objected to until it is seen that it prevents the publication of legitimate news. If the circulation were still in the expected stage reports of the effect of the current upon the individual placed in the chair might have some value in determining the suitability of the electric chair as a substitute for the gallows, inasmuch as it is pretty well established that electrocution does not constitute cruelty in comparison with other forms of capital punishment. There is no good reason for the details of the death struggle of each criminal being elaborated in the columns of the press. Any unusual event in connection with an electrocution will always find its way into print without the reporters witnessing the death scene. Executions of the United States Senate rarely contain any great details of the gods of publicity in the Press Gallery that is not ground to use mills grind "exceeding fine," though "exceeding rapid," and what is true of news, getting in the National Capital is true elsewhere.

DEMOCRATIC AND FAIR

It would appear that the favorite sons who are attempting to defeat Congressman Helm are starting off badly. The platform adopted at the State Convention stands for the primary method of making nominations, it was ratified at the recent election by a overwhelming majority, and is now the party creed. The question is really arises would not those who will disregard or attempt to evade obligations of a State Platform also refuse to respect the pledges of a National Platform?

Just after the election the Interior Journal called attention to the fact that there was on foot a movement to precipitate a meeting of the district committee for the purpose of calling a special convention to nominate a congressional candidate before the legislature could meet, and exact the promised primary law. That they tried to get together enough of the district committee to effect this call for a meeting was shown when a part of the members of this congressional district committee were meeting at Lexington to attend to the Carroll matter, and an effort was made to get the other members of the congressional committee who were not members of the Carroll committee and not concerned in the Carroll nomination to come there. This attempt was what started the action in Anderson county. The Chairman of the Anderson County Committee is not a member of the Carroll district committee, but is a member of this Congressional Committee, as are the Chairman of Shelby and Spencer. When the Chairman of the Anderson Committee, in behalf of our party's platform obligation, found that he and other outsiders were wanted at Lexington, he "smelt a mouse," called the precinct members of his county committee together, told them that he was about to be asked to vote for a congressional candidate at a primary for the nomination of congressmen, and asked them to instruct him to vote against the congressional

considering the interest of the party superior to the interest of any candidate, in spite of the fact that they had a bouqe candidate, who they knew wanted the convention, voted by a virtually unanimous vote to instruct their chairman to vote in all district meetings for nominations by primary, instead of convention, because, as they explained, and as the Chairman heartily agreed, the party stands committed to that method and to do otherwise, especially now in advance of the legislative meeting, would be to plainly set aside the party will evade the law in advance, and cheat out of a vote the democrats who have been promised this primary method. The action of the Anderson Committee demonstrates the regard for platform obligations and sets a good example for the other counties. If it is being sought to get any other county chairman in this district so misrepresent his party and county, the precinct committee men and every democratic voter in his county should hold up his hands in doing what is right, fair, and democratic.

It has always been considered, by the people, that the candidate who opposes a primary admits his weakness and they will be slow to place confidence in the candidate that does not heed the obligations contained in his party's platform.
