

"Has your wheat been infected by the Hessian fly this season' is a question that the U. S. Det partment of Agriculture is now asking farmers. The information is desired that there may be general do operation between all concerned in reducing the devastations of the fly. There is every indication teat the pest with beaunausually troublesome to the crop this fall.

Every wheat grower in the coam fry who subspeers that his crop has been infested is requested to seed his name to the Department's Bureau of Entomology at at Washington, D. C. with a requestion so be answered arc merely as to whether the wheat grower's crop was infested at certain seasons. The farmer will then be asked to forward some of the infested wheat plants for examination, postáge to be paid by the Government He will also be asked to give his name, address and the nearest railway station.


