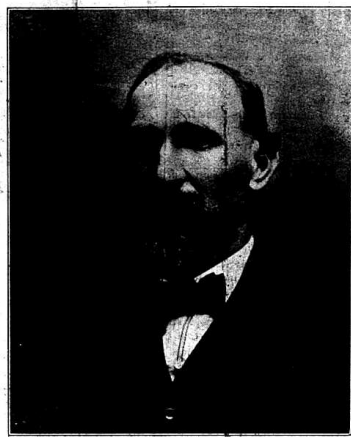
LATEST WAR NEWS

American torpedo boats destroyers were ordered to the coast and the men are pulling the Eastern Atlantic search for German submarines which have wrought such disaster to shipping and been the cause, in their nefarious practice of sinking boats unwarned, of sending hundreds of Americans to their death.

eration of the war budget appropriate over \$3,000,000,000. The Council of National Defense, the Shipping Board and the President were scored by Senators, who found fault with contracts and the manner of procedure in preparations for war. No progress was made on the bill in hand, and only a small number of Senators defended the Administration from a tactics.

The House adopted the conference report on the War Army Bill after the Senate conferees had agreed to the House provision increasing the pay of enlisted men. Fiscal action by the Senate is expected today or Friday and immediately after the bill is signed by the President registration of those subject to draft will be begun and the department will also outline the procedure to be followed in bringing the National Guard into the Federal service.
