

Prime Minister Lloyd George of Great Britain has himself told us with considerable clearness what has gone before in this matwhat has gone before in this matter. The harm that was "one seems to be almost entirely attributable to the professional soldier of Great Britain. The allies knew then just as clearly is they know now that this great German blow was to fall.
