"I WAS there—at Verdun—in Octo-ber, 1918—and the Salvation Army was my best bet.

"We'd been in the front line 36 hours. "We'd been in the front line 36 hours. We had moved so fast our kitchens were lost and had no 'chow.' 'Zero hour' was set for 5:30 next morning. We 'went over,' and after three hours in No Man's Land a machine gun bullet got me in the leg.

got me in the leg.

"Littler bearers of Co. I, 127th Infantry, picked me up. On the way back, before we reached the first aid regimental dressing station, they put the litter on the ground, just behind our old front line, and a Salvation Army man gave me doughnuts, good oht coffee and cigarettes. And, let me tell you, high explosive and gas shells were falling mighty thick around us!

"It was the first food I'd had in 39 hours. The pain was fierce, and I was bleeding a lot. The doughnuts, cofee and smokes did more than simply put new life into me. The Salvation Army was my best bet.

"As I lay on the litter waiting for the ambu-lance all I could think of was how good the coffee and smokes tasted—my own tobac-co was too bloody to smoke.

"All of us knew the Salvation Army was behind us. They were real folks, and we knew we wouldn't have to ask for help if we needed it. We knew we could count on them, and believe me, it kept up our spirits.

"I sure wish I could get out and root for the Salvation Army and tell you about them in-stead of writing."
