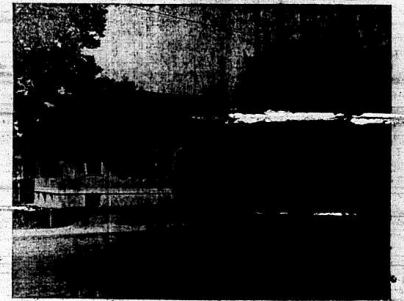

**Louisville Cement Company's Community House**

By E. R. Gentry, Director of Social Work, Louisville Cement Company.  
The Louisville Cement Company's Community House has been in operation for more than eight months. While it is too early yet to show the real results of the work done, we feel that the crucial period is past, and we can speak with confidence, not only for what has actually been accomplished, but what we must expect from the work as time passes.

The building is constructed of concrete and stucco. It has a front of 78 feet, with a depth, including an L. of 68 feet, which gives a room porch in the rear. There is a spacious lounging and reading room furnished with tables and comfortable chairs, opening from this room through wide entrances which have no doors; one enters the poolroom, where are two tables. There is also a refreshment stand and an office for the superintendent in the rear of the building. On the right of the main entrance. On the left, as one enters, is a rest room for ladies only and furnished especially for them with connecting washroom and toilet. The auditorium occupies the remainder of the "L" and has a seating capacity of about three hundred. For lectures, picture shows and other entertainments for that purpose. The auditorium has a stage with curtains, etc., which are removable. We use this room for all kinds of athletics such as basket ball, volleyball, boxing and wrestling. When no otherwise in use, this room is left open as a playroom for the children, where they play all sorts of games when the weather prevents them from playing out of doors. In the basement we have men's toilet, shower baths, a barber shop and necessary store rooms. The building is steam heated, electric lighted, and has hot and cold water, all furnished from the plant, which is only a few hundred feet away. In the rear of the building is a tract of several acres of ground which is being converted into a park and playground. We already have a tennis court, volleyball court and croquet ground. Shade trees have been planted and other improvements will be added to beautify the place. The front has been sodded, making a beautiful lawn, in which there are already four large trees. We have flower beds nicely arranged, and the walk approaching the building in a wide circle has been bordered with hedge and flowers. Projecting from each of the four French doorways in front are decorative

porticoes and large porch or window boxes filled with flowers, which give a touch of beauty and freshness to the interiors as well as the exterior of the reception room. A short distance from the building we plan to have a real athletic field. We already have a good base ball diamond here and have built a grandstand that will accommodate about three hundred people, and can easily be enlarged. The building and grounds have been furnished and equipped by the company. This equipment includes two pool tables, all the tables and chairs piano, Victrola, with a music set of records, and a splendid moving picture outfit. It also includes athletic equipment such as a wrestling mat, boxing gloves medicine ball, volleyball and net, basket balls, indoor base balls and bats, as well as all kinds of small games such as checkers, rook, etc.

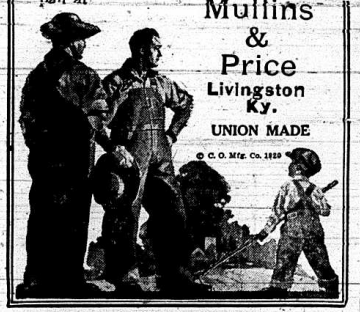

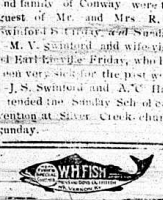
