CLINTON COUNTY

Will Give Bethuram Five to Eight Hundred Majority, Says Special to Commonwealth.

Hon. W. A. Dickon Introduces Judge B. J. Bethuram, Who Delivers Great Speech

Cumberland City, Ky., June 11.—Special to The Commonwealth.—This was a great day politically for the little town of Bethuram. It was held for a speech at 7:30 this evening and arrived in time to meet his engagement. Judge Catron was also billed to speak but it was announced that he became ill and had to return home, and could not fill the appointment.

Promptly on time the speaking began. Judge Bethuram was introduced by Hon. W. A. Dickon, Chairman of the Clinton Republican Committee, Cashier Citizens Bank, of Albany, and manager for Judge Bethuram's opponent in this county. Mr. Dickon is now enthusiastic for Judge Bethuram, and in the course of his remarks gave some of the reasons why he is now supporting Judge Bethuram. He said in part:

"My friends and neighbors, I am here this evening to again thank you for your loyal support given many years ago for the office of sheriff of this county. You elected me to that office when I was young and just beginning my career. I have never forgotten the kindness of you to me to first give me the honor conferred upon me. Since then I have always tried to do what I could to advance the cause of the party, and believing that to support Judge Bethuram in this primary election will be the best interest of the Republican party, and that his election to the office of Circuit Judge will be a continuation of the party of the best and capable Judge, I promise to give him my unqualified support. I don't propose to support any candidate for the office of Circuit Judge who has gone out and made speeches for the Democratic party, and tried to fasten Democratic rule upon the people. I now have the honor to introduce to you Judge B. J. Bethuram, the present and next Circuit Judge."

Judge Bethuram then began his speech, and held the audience spellbound for more than an hour. He defended his administration against an account of his stewardship, and with telling effect made the unfair and unjust attacks that his opponent had been making against him, and showed that the opposition was engaged in the most scandalous, abusive and insulting campaign that has ever been known in the history of this or any other district, and that in the face of a solemn promise that the campaign would be kept clean and upon a high plane. He depicted the attacks and assaults of the opposition that he would refrain from it and trust to the intelligence and faith of the people. The speech had assured him that nothing but a faithful opposition would publish or say from the stump, would lower him in their estimation, and that all they risk is that they ignore the wisest attacks that the other side is making.

Judge Bethuram spoke of his own service for the Republican party as a soldier in the great conflict of 1861-1865, and of his own service in the late war, and with much earnestness stated the work that in order to support a true and consistent Republican in the coming year they must support him as he is the only candidate for the post. Judge that could "trifle" by claims to such a position.

Judge Bethuram said many other good things but to refer to it all would require too much space in your valuable paper. It is sufficient to say that he pleased the great crowd immensely, and all went away for the Judge.

Cumberland City and Piney Woods are practically a unit for Bethuram. He will carry the northern part of Clinton county by more than five to one, and the tide continues in his favor the opposition will get nothing. From what we learn, Clinton county will give Judge Bethuram anywhere from five to eight hundred majority. The campaign just closed by Judge Bethuram and Judge Catron has been a most successful one in every way. They promptly rejected every falsehood started by the opposition, and since the opposition is founded upon falsehood and nothing else, there has been a steady swing toward our old Judge from the time his campaign started.

The crowd here last night was estimated at from two to three hundred, and was more than three times the size of the crowd at Morrow and Knoxville this afternoon. Keep your eye on Clinton county.—Somerset Commonwealth.
