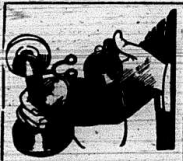

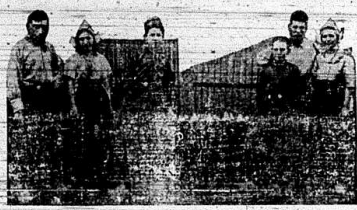

COMMUNITY MEETING

More than 150 people in the Poplar Grove community attended a community meeting at the School house, Wednesday night, May 31. The County Agent discussed the value of Community Meetings and the Cooperation of Farmers. The latter part of the meeting was very interesting because more than a score of questions concerning fertilizer, live stock, crops, bees, etc. were asked and discussed.—More than 100 bulletins were distributed to the people who desired them and the subjects they were most interested in. Before the meeting closed arrangements were made to have another community meeting on June 30. At this time it is hoped that the County Agent will give lantern slide lectures on farm crops and club work. The Junior-Club work was mentioned and a movement was organized as a movement started for the organization of a club in charge of Mrs. Cook.

We hope that a permanent community organization will be perfected at Poplar Grove. It is a good thing to see that the people are very anxious to grow and develop in the way of community life.

One of the largest growers of oats, Quail and Poplar Grove communities is a limestone quarry. Each of these communities is in a rich limestone but not in available form. A pulverizer would make it possible for these soils to produce almost any crop with a liberal application of phosphorus.

The County Agent visited a number of farms in the Poplar Grove communities and found that the farmers were growing a large amount of corn growing under the stirring interest of many progressive farmers.
