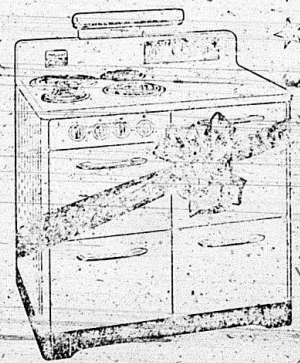

Blouse 'n' Skirt With New Look Bib Aprons Make Special Gifts

LYNN CHAMBERS' MENU. Browned Short-Ribs of Beef Glazed Carrots Browned Potatoes Cauliflower Au Gratin Tossed Salad Baked Peas Eggbraggs Ice Box Cookies *Recipe given.

Milk. Add flour sifted with salt and baking powder. Fold in nuts and dates. Pour into a shallow, greased pan and bake 20 minutes at 350 degrees. Cut into narrow slices while still warm and roll in powdered-sugar.

Ice Box Cookies. 1 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup butter 1 egg, unbeaten 1 1/2 cups flour 1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar 1/2 teaspoon soda 1/2 cup pecans, cut fine 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Cream sugar and butter well together. Add the egg, flour, cream of tartar and soda. Mix well and fold in nuts and vanilla. Make into rolls about 2 inches in diameter, and wrap each in waxed paper. Let stand in refrigerator for 24 hours. Then un-wrap rolls and slice about 1/4 inch thick. Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for about 8 minutes, or until golden brown.

Fudge Squares. (Makes 36) 2 squares unsweetened chocolate 1/2 cup butter or substitute 1/2 cup light corn syrup 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla 1/2 cup chopped nut meats

Melt chocolate and butter in top of double boiler. Add remaining ingredients, blending thoroughly. Pack firmly into an 8-inch square pan. Sprinkle a few chopped nuts on top if desired. Bake in a hot oven (325 degrees) for 12 minutes. When cool, turn out of pan and cut in squares. Store in refrigerator if warm.

Brazil Nut Patties. 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup apricot 1/2 cup water 1/2 cup butter 1 pound brazil nut meats

Combine ingredients. Cook to 250 degrees or the crack stage. Pour carefully over brazil nuts arranged over a marble slab. Loosen patties when they become too hard to prevent them from cracking.

Maple Creams. 1 cup maple sugar 1 cup light brown sugar 1 1/2 cups water 1/2 teaspoon almond extract 1/2 pound nut meats

Cook the sugars and water to 240 degrees, or the soft ball stage. Push the almond extract and cool to lukewarm. Then beat until creamy. Knead until smooth, form into small balls and shape a nut meat in each ball. Stuff with marshmallows. 1 box marshmallows 1/2 pound nut meats (whole meats) Lay the marshmallows on a table and, with a sharp knife, make a gash into the center of each. Push the nut meat (English walnut, pecan, hickory or peanut) into this opening, and press marshmallow closed with fingers. If they seem too hard to press, they may be dipped in chocolate if desired.

EUROPE IS SHOWING US

The whole history of civilization since the dawn of time has been the story of man's struggle against oppression. Every school child is required to study the great milestones in that struggle—the signing of the Magna Carta, the writing of the Declaration of Independence, and the rest. All the revolutions ever fought have marked the attempts of peoples to free themselves from the chains of emperors' dictators, and corrupt and cruel governments.

Now almost all of Europe and much of the rest of the world have turned back the clock. They have, willingly or otherwise, succumbed once more to super-government. They have apparently placed the goal of a dubious physical security ahead of that of freedom. They have accepted the disciplinary weapons of dictatorship—the whipping post, the execution block, the concentration camp, slave labor. Even England, though she still clings to the basic civil liberties, has gone a long way down the road that can end only in spiritual darkness and the submersion of the individual spirit.

In the United States, we have gone farther along the same road most of us realize. We have created an enormous, ever-growing bureaucracy which saps our energies and our wealth. Worst of all, we have largely lost the definite distinctions established by the Constitution between the three branches of government—executive, judicial, and legislative. The result of this is more and more "administrative government"—which is simply supplanting a government of law by a government of men.

Nations, like individuals, can learn by example. Europe is showing us what happens when we turn to government to give us "security"—and, of necessity, make government the dominant factor in our lives. This is the way that tyrants come to power, and the process has not changed in two thousand years of recorded history. If we permit it, it can happen here as well.

AN HONEST PRICE

One unfortunate phase of the price problem is—that everyone seems to be looking for a pat solution, which will solve it in one fell swoop.

The fact is that the problem is simply the sum total of innumerable other problems and forces, some of them of extreme complexity. For example, high wages contribute to high prices. Foreign aid contributes to high prices. Government fiscal policy, which is still strongly inflationary,

contributes to high prices. Our record national income (increased printed money), which no one wants to reduce, contributes to high prices.

The worst illusion of all is that a return to price control of the OPA type would solve the problem. The government could set a low price for an article—but it couldn't make anyone produce that article if the price involved an operating loss. Price control would drive goods inexorably into the black market, which would then become the real market. Most dangerous of all, price control would be completely impossible unless it involved the strictest kinds of wage and other controls—and subjected the nation to some kind of an economic dictatorship.

During the next year, prices may go up or they may come down. No one knows, and, as the experience of the past year or two shows, the forecasters are almost invariably wrong. But, in a free economy where open competition exists all along the commodity line, down to the chain or independent store from which you buy your goods, the price will be an honest price. It will be an accurate reflection of present-day costs and conditions. And that is all that anyone can expect.

WHAT WILL THE DOLLAR BUY?

It seems to be universally believed that the principal labor organizations will demand new and substantial wage increases early next year.

The steady rise in the cost of living may justify this. But, at the same time, the rank and file of labor as well as the union leaders should give serious thought to what continued wage boosts without any improvement in worker productivity will mean.

The worker's real interest is not merely in how many dollars his pay envelope contains. It is, instead, in how much food, clothing, housing and everything else those dollars will buy. In Germany, after the first war, labor received billions of marks a day. But those billions of marks wouldn't buy enough to keep a family alive. That is always the result of unbridled inflation.

One of the reasons for high commodity prices is that the wage of wage increases which followed the last war was not accompanied by more output per man. In many key industries, output has been below the 1941 level. In other words, the emphasis has been on more pay for less work. That is a suicidal doctrine, and carried to the ultimate conclusion will cause complete deterioration of the purchasing power of the dollar and economic chaos on a grand scale.

A few top labor leaders have emphasized these facts lately and have told their memberships that greater production is essential if the living standards of the country are to be protected. It all comes back to the fact that we can't get something for nothing—we must pay for everything in one fashion or another. Labor, like any other group, must earn its keep.

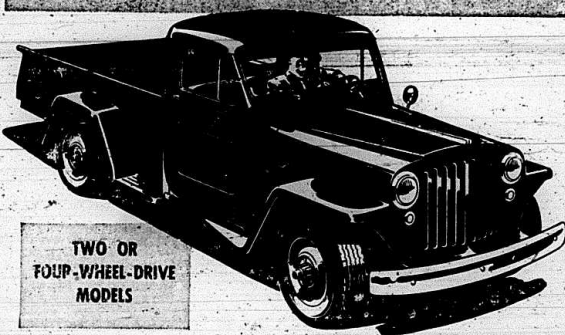
