### Portable Laboratory Used

#### To Test Milk at Source

A modern laboratory on wheels is providing scientific tests for Wisconsin's milk supply right up to the delivery of the milk to the consumer.

The mobile laboratory is operated by the Wisconsin state department of agriculture. When the mobile laboratory comes into a community, samples of milk and cream will be picked up by department dairy inspectors and sediment and moisture tests given direct microscopic examination to identify the type of bacteria and to determine whether the milk has been produced under proper sanitary conditions.

Samples of milk from each farm will be tested to determine whether or not the pasteurization has been proper and complete. In addition to the tests, the mobile laboratory will follow up the tests by farm visits where the dairyman will be shown how to improve production methods.

Work of the laboratory staff will not be limited to separate tests. In addition to the tests, the mobile laboratory conferences will be held with plant operators, and city and health officials.

### Insulate for Comfort

Permeation and condensation heating in winter and, to some extent, keeping the house cool in summer depend largely on retaining the flow of heat between the inside and the outside of the building. Insulating the house to keep the heat in also helps to prevent the entrance of heat from the sun through the roof and walls in hot weather. As long as there is a difference in temperature between the inside and the outside of the house, there is a flow of heat from the warm side to the cooler side. To determine the amount of heat lost in winter, and to decide what steps should be taken to reduce it, we pass through windows and doors, the loss through infiltration and the loss through walls, roof, and floors must be considered to reduce the loss through each.

**Mount Lassen Volcano**

One of the greatest fields of former volcanic activity in the world lies in the northwestern corner of the United States. Its lavas cover a quarter of a million square miles and include the great lava flows of California, Nevada, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming. Most of this great region were once active and fertile. The eruption of the great Mount Lassen is apparent only to the eye of the geologist, except where the levelled cones of mountain volcanoes rise from the Cascade range, where Lassen peak still smokes snakes and steam and activity is evidenced by a few hot springs above the forest of Yellowstone.

them were hurried for death. Five hundred is the more likely estimate of the toll of human lives in Kentucky, and dramatization of the slaughter should not be necessary to impel the Assembly to act. At present 8,500,000 cars are inspected to four times a year. If there is a good reason why Kentucky is without compulsory inspection I don't know it. Do you? If you overlooked the toll in human lives, in people crippled for life, and considered inspection from the sordid standpoint of dollars and cent only, you would approve such a law, because accidents prevented would run to far more than operation of a good inspection law would cost. If Kentucky had inspection as much as four times a year would be deducted from the 50 cent fee for each test, especially if the examiner knew his business. That would enable me to tell a service garageman what was the matter with the vehicle, which would be a lot better than having the mechanic guests at the trouble. Then I would feel safer always when driving. New Jersey, which seems to have made the most notable success with an inspection law, requires two tests a year, and a 50 cent fee has paid for the program thus far. The New Jersey system is ten years old January 10, and its operation

...dried cheese... prepared by mixing dried cheese... into the mash at the rate of 25 per cent of the total feed mixture. This is fed for a period of four to seven days. It is recommended that a feeding of the flushing mash be repeated one day every three weeks throughout the chick growing period. When mixed in mashes at recommended levels for normal feeding dried cheese helps maintain healthy elimination without a flushing effect. The maintenance of a "friendly bacteria" in the intestines, aided by lactose, also favors assimilation of minerals in the ration, especially calcium and phosphorus.

**How Geysers Perform**  
Geysers have been defined as hot springs which intermittently eject columns of boiling water and steam. They are found only at places where the internal heat of the earth approaches the surface. The action of the geyser is comparatively simple. Water from the surface or from subterranean sources collects in the bottom of a deep tube-shaped opening in the rocks. The opening which has been enlarged from a crevice by the dissolving action of heated waters charged with sulphur gases, is known as the geyser tube. The water in the bottom of this tube is heated by hot gases rising from below or by contact with heated rocks, but because of the weight of the column of cooler water in the tube above, it does not form bubbles of steam although it has attained a temperature above the boiling point. The hot water gradually rises until the entire column of water becomes heated and the water near the surface, which is under less pressure, begins to boil, causing a certain amount of water to overflow the rim of the geyser.

**Cleaning Your Clock**  
Generally when a clock stops it needs cleaning and oiling. To clean and oil a clock, you need to take it apart. Take a leather and silk cloth until there is a tiny bit of fine material on the small end, then dip that in gasoline or kerosene and brush the bearings of the clock slightly, being careful not all times not to damage the hair spring and balance wheel. By using care there is little danger of doing damage to your clock. Never touch the metal parts of your clock with your hands if you can avoid it. If you do so, it means tarnish afterwards. After the heating, gasoline or naphtha has evaporated use a very light fine oil or mineral oil thinned with kerosene. Moisture the leather with this oil and brush lightly on the bearings.

**Many Farmers Fly**  
National Flying Farmers association is the sole nationwide organization of aviation-minded farmers and ranchers. Only 18 months old, it boasts some 2,700 members in 27 state chapters, stretching from New Jersey to California. An estimated 50 per cent of the members already fly their own craft, while the rest either have planes on order or hope to acquire one in the next few years. Only requirements for membership in the National Flying Farmers are that the applicant hold a private pilot's license and that he or she be interested in flying his plane for the furtherance of agriculture.


**RURAL SOCIOLOGY MADE DEPARTMENT AT U.K.**  
A more effective study of rural people, their communities, and institutions has been made possible by the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees with approval of the establishment of a new Department of Rural Sociology. Dr. Howard W. Beers, welfare specialist known throughout the state and professor of rural sociology at the University since 1939, was named to head the new department of the College of Agriculture and Home Economics, effective Jan. 1. Rural sociology first became a distinct curriculum at U.K. in 1929 but has been offered as a course since 1931. At present, the subject is included as a second course in the Department of Economics. 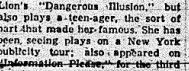

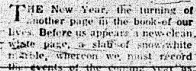

In the words of J. C. Penney: "Socialized medicine is another Utopian scheme to convince the American people they can get something for nothing."

Even assuming the financial phase of the matter, socialized medicine would have to be paid for in the coin of political domination of medical care. In time, every doctor, dentist, nurse, hospital, clinic, research center and medical school would feel the power of a gigantic bureaucracy. Political favor, rather than ability, would be the road to advancement. Under these circumstances, a sharp decline in the standards of medical care would be as inevitable as tomorrow morning.

The opposition to socialized or regimented medicine is not based on a negative approach. Positive action is being taken through inclusive, low-cost, voluntary pre-payment plans, of which the largest has 30,000,000 Americans enrolled. These plans are now available to the majority of all people, and in time will be within the reach of all. The

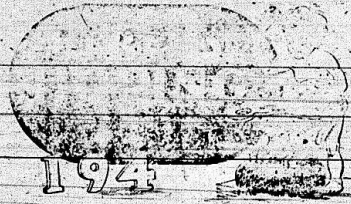

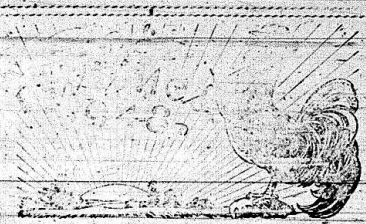
