In the words of J. C. Penney, "Socialized medicine is another Utopian scheme to convince the American people they gan get something for nothing."

Socialized medicine would be one of the most costly endeavors we could undertake. For instance, the proposed Wagner-Murray-Dingell bill, which would be only the first step toward socialization of the healing arts, would cost a minimum of \$4,000,000,000 a year to administer, and might cost in excess of \$6,000,000,000 - every dime of which would come, directly or indirectly, from the pockets of labor, in-

dustey and the general inspayer.

Even dismissing the financial phase of the matter, socialized medicine would have to be paid for in the coin of political domination of medical care. In time, every doctor, dentist, nurse, hospital, clinic, research center and medical school would feel the power of a gigantic bureaucracy. Political fayor, rather than ability, would be the road-to advancement. Under these circumstances, a sharp decline in the standards of medical care would be as inevitable as tomorpow morning.

The opposition to socialized or regimented medicine is based on a negative approach. Positive action is being taken through inclusive, low-cost, voluntary pre-payment plans, of which the largest has 30,000,000 Americans rolled. These plans are now available to the majority of our cople, and in time will be within the reach of all. The
