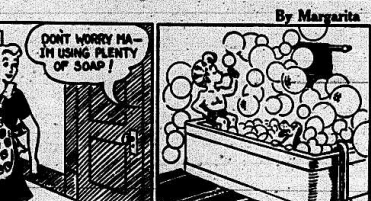

Sexing of Baby Chicks Proves Difficult Task

Chick sexing is difficult to learn, and in order to become proficient it is necessary to receive expert instructions and to have considerable practice and experience with thousands of chickens.

Reliable authorities have stated that a student must sex at least 200,000 cockerets before the male genital emulgence can be accurately recognized. The best sexing method is endorsed with a natural ability to recognize and classify the various types of genital emulgence to be found in chickens, but accuracy is obtained only by regular practice, investigation of errors and a liking for the job.

Fertilizer Won't Solve Entire Farm Problem

Many farmers are inclined to see fertilizer as a crutch by attempting to make it substitute for good soil management.

Good fertilizer, in it cannot do the entire job. It must be backed up by other practices that add organic matter, build soil structure and boost crop yields.

New Insecticides Are Non-Poisonous to Bees

One serious cause of bee poisoning has been that bees have taken dusts containing arsenic and have stored this poison in a combination with pollen in the hive. Arsenic remains permanently poisonous but newer insecticidal dusts and sprays, such as DDT, DNE and D.D.T., are less dangerous to beneficial insects as the toxic effects will break down gradually.

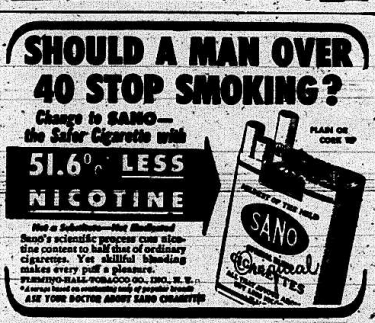

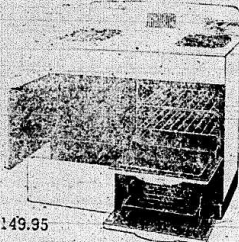

Mr. John Lair and Renfro Valley Folk

On the Opening of your Pioneer Museum

The Renfro Valley Pioneer Museum is no longer open to question; it is now open to the public. There had been so much discussion on the formation and presentation of such a collection of antiques and relics that no doubt it had begun to seem that it was all talk and no action.

Sunday morning, May thirtieth, the doors were officially opened to visitors. Mrs. Dora Criswell being the first to apply for admission, was presented with a lifetime pass permitting her to attend, free, any Renfro Valley show or exhibition during her lifetime. On the preceding of the museum to a limited group on Saturday night Miss Katharine Long was first to purchase a ticket and has likewise been given a lifetime pass to all Renfro Valley activities.

Of outstanding interest to most visitors was the music room of the Museum where is to be found the most complete collection of old music in the country, in addition to a display of old musical instruments, including sixteen old music boxes of different types but all in playing order.

The typical log cabin home, furnished exactly as such a home was furnished in pioneer days came in for its share of attention. Most of the furnishings were relics in the Lair family and include the crib and high chair made for his grandfather at the time of his birth, in 1832. Another treasured bit of family furniture is the old corner cupboard owned by Mr.



Lair's great-grandmother in 1721 still containing some of the dishes kept in it at that time.

The gun collection held the interest of the men folk. The original collection of more than four hundred rifles, swords and pistols has been reduced to fine specimens, no two alike,

and dating back to an old Spanish gun with silver inlay barrel apparently left in the mountains by Spanish explorers a hundred years before Daniel Boone came into Kentucky. Interesting items are a group of novelty pistols and duplicates of the two with which President Lincoln and President McKinley were assassinated.

An extensive collection of old school books carries old-timers back to the days of the blue-back-speller and the McGuffey readers and wall charts, while the old school bell which has called many generations of Renfro Valley scholars to books and slates hangs silent on the wall.

In the home craft department an old loom carries the weaving of a rag carpet, a quilt 125 years old hangs on the wall with others dating back to pre-Civil War Days, winders and carders and spinning wheels galore stand in mute witness of the days when mother clothed the family the hard way.

But there are too many things to write about. You'll have to come and see for yourself the many articles which go to make up the Renfro Valley Pioneer Museum. It would be hard to get from the printed page any idea of the milling exhibit, with its primitive hand mill, pestle and mortar and other steps in the development of milling to say nothing of the other items which go to make up a display occupying the entire upper floor of the newest and biggest building in Renfro Valley.
