FIRST AID to the AILING HOUSE

QUESTION: There is a little crack directly over my sink which forms a joint with the plaster wall. The white plaster used for filling the crack always comes out. What can be done?
ANSWER: Before the war it was possible to get a great, flexible metal moulting that was made for a crack such as yours, or to cover the crack at the top of a bathtub in a reasonable not find any of this, fill the crack with a light-colored caulking compound. This resembles putty, but never becomes hard or brittle. After forcing it into the crack, run your finger along the surface to smooth it, and after a few days, touch it up with enamel to match the wall.

ANSWER: Small quantities of a drain cleaner can be safely used, but large quantities will stop bacterial action. In such cases, a large volume of water should be run into the tank to carry off the chemicals. Bacterial action can then be re-started by dissolving six cakes of yeast in a gallon of water in a washbasin and flushing it into the tank.

Electric Appliances Require Safe, Convenient Location Small-electric appliances require a safe as well as a convenient place to stand if they are to be kept in good condition and repair bills are to be avoided. A safe place is both dry and level.

Kitchen and kitchen counters generally are the best places for using appliances, but the drainage of the sink is not. Electricity can travel through water. Therefore, wet hands, wet terminals and wet cords invite injury to the user as well as to the appliance. Water can ruin the heating element. Moreover, a sloping drainboard may lead to appliance slip and fall.

Extra care is the cause of much damage to small appliances in homes. Just one tumbler can put an iron or toaster out of order and spoil its appearance as well. Every appliance should stand level. The cord should be out of the way so no one will catch or trip on it and pull down the appliance.

## HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Teach your puppy to stand still and have his feet wiped before he comes in the house. This takes time and patience, but eventually pays off by minimizing muddy tracks on a clean kitchen floor; children can sometimes be taught to wipe their own feet, too.

Corn meal will soak up oil or grease on a basement or garage floor if spread over grease and allowed to stand for a day or two. Then sweep up corn meal; repeat if necessary.

FORECASTING THE PRICE TREND

Will commodity prices go up? Go down? Stay where they are?

Newsweek recently asked 50 leading economists, connected with business, labor, governmental, statistical and educational institutions to forecast the price trend for the balance of the year. Twenty-six thought prices would continue upward; 14 said they will remain about the same and the remaining ten believe they will be lower by the year's end.

Averaging the answers, the consensus is that prices won't change substantially one way or the other. That may be a disappointment to the consumer, who has watched his dollar shrink like wool in water, but it is completely understandable. Spending—by government business, and the individuals—goes to higher and higher peaks. The vast sums

being spent for foreign aid and military purposes will further strain the supply-demand balance. And millions of Americans have a higher standard of living than they ever had before.

So, when you go shopping, don't expect to find a lot of bargains soon. What you will find, however, are merchants who sell you what you want at a far lower profit margin than most people realize. That is true whether you patronize the chains, the independents, the specialty shops, or anything else. The profits per sale are so small, generally speaking, that if they didn't exist at all it would make little difference in your purchasing power. Retail trade, whether we realize it or not, deserves much of the credit for the abundance that exists in this nation.
