prisone for desertion, crime to violation of discipline during the reent war. Even more tragic, some prisoners have suffered "perment physical impairment" in solitary confinement. This was concised in a recent circular issued by the air force inspector general.

Meant only for the eyes of the top brass, the circular warned grimly that regulations governing the treatment of these prisoners were "not being com-plied with."

"It is essential," the air inspec-tor general stressed, "that pris-oners in solitary confinement on bread and water be given one full meal every three days and that medical authorities examine them medical authorities daily.

"Failure of medical authorities to perform the prescribed examination has, in the past, led to permanent physical impairment."
