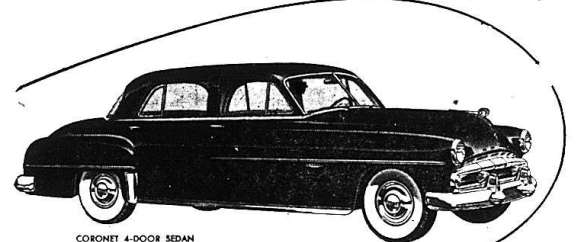

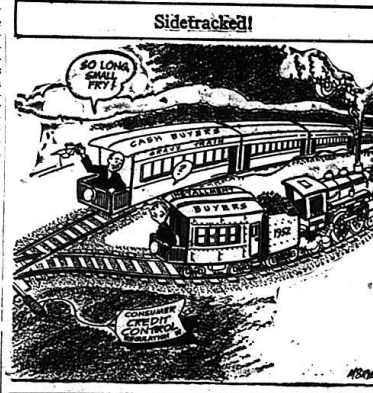

It's a One-Minute Job!

BUDGET-CONSCIOUS newyleeds who have books but neither a coffee table nor full parlor can solve their problem quickly and with minor expense. They can put a table together without nails or other fasteners in just about one minute flat!

Here's what they, or anyone, can do: Go to a lumber yard for some hollow clay tiles, which are 4 inches wide and a foot square. These will serve as sup-



ports for the table and should be spaced 3 feet apart for a top that is 36" thick. At the lumber yard, they should obtain a brand new material known as Plyron, since it is ideally suited for table tops or shelving. The dealer can cut it into the required length and the 12-inch width needed to fit over the tiles. This new combination of familiar materials, Plyron, has a core of plywood and faces of smooth, splinter-free Masonite hardboard. The unique new panel's plywood core makes it puncture-proof, strong and rigid. Its surfaces have the characteristic of Masonite tempered hardboard—hardness, smoothness, wear-resistance, paintability and moisture-resistance.

A two-tier coffee table can double as a book shelf, as shown in the illustration. Both the tiles and the boards may be left unfinished or may be painted, depending on the budget and the owner's wishes. Plyron has numerous other uses around the home such as book or plant shelves and cabinet doors.

### PARK HOTELS HAVE LOTS OF SPACE

You can still have a reservation in the Kentucky State Parks for your vacation. This statement came today from Conservation Commissioner Henry Ward, who emphatically denied that any of the state parks are booked up for the rest of the season. In the past several days, reports have reached me of rumors which say that some of the state parks are already booked up for the rest of the season. Nothing could be more misleading.

The new Kenlake Hotel at Kentucky Lake State Park was the place most mentioned in the rumors. It was opened March 15th but only a few reservations have been made. Three vacation parks Kentucky Dam Village, Kentucky

### Lake and Cumberland Falls operate the year round. The others will open May 15.

### HUNGER SIGNS IN VARIOUS CROPS

Lack of any one of certain plant foods produces symptoms of hunger signs in crops, according to a fertilizer circular of the University of Kentucky Experiment Station. Insufficient nitrogen in tobacco causes a light green to yellow color, beginning in the lower leaves and progressing up the stalks. If severe, lower leaves waste away.

Lack of potash in the soil causes yellowing of tobacco and turning down of tips and edges of leaves. If severe, yellow areas cover the leaves and affected parts die and fall out. Ragged, poor quality leaf results.

In corn, lack of nitrogen brings light green to yellow color, beginning along the midveins in lower leaves and going up the stalk and causing firing in dry weather. Lack of potash causes yellowing and drying of edges of leaves, leaf scorch, light chaffy ears and poorly filled ends. Where there is not enough phosphorus, corn leaves tend to turn purple. Purpling, however, may result from cool nights and insect injury to roots.

Lack of potash in alfalfa and clovers shows up in the yellowing of the edges of the leaves, or small white spots appear near the leaf margins.

Leaves of alfalfa suffering from lack of boron tend to become yellow and sometimes red near the ends. Yellowing of alfalfa leaves is similar to that caused by injury also causes yellowing of leaves.

### IN THE GARDEN

Let early greens sowing has been overlooked, here is a last reminder to get them in as there is nothing finer than these first comers among the vegetables. They are Giant Southern Curled mustard Scotch kale, Bloomsdale spinach and even Essex rape, commonly regarded as only stock feed, but which can stand quite hot weather, as some of the others cannot.

The soil should be rich with manure, or if it is not, the rows should be side dressed in nitrate or with dried powdered poultry manure. Row culture is advised so that plant lice and cabbage worms can be stopped.

Control all the black flea-beetles that sometimes destroy greens at seedling stage. For

the cabbage greens, one ounce of seed sows 100 feet, for spinach, one ounce sows 50 feet. Another cabbage green that is tenegreen, known, too, as virtue of becoming usable 30 days after sowing, and can be planted in any month.

Radishes are timely to sow should be used in more gardens, especially the white varieties that bear warm weather becoming hot much more slowly than the red sorts. The old stand-by varieties are Lady Finger and Icicle. There is a new red and white radish that is known by two names, Cher has behaved well for the writer. Belle and Cavalier Even sown quite too thickly when those radishes were pulled that were ready, the others came along to make good radishes that stayed sweet and solid even to the end of June.

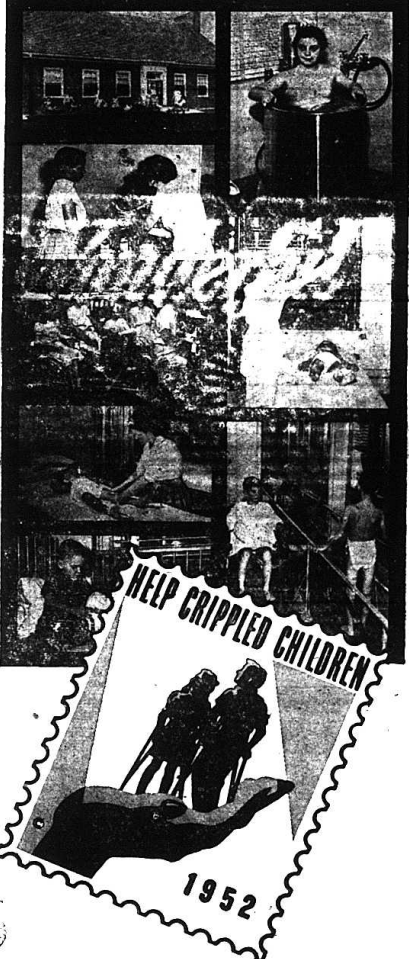
