All persons over fifteen years of age are urged to make sure they do not have tuberculosis by having a chest x-ray. The service is being made available through the cooperation of the Kentucky State Department of health, the Rockcastle County Health Department and the Kentucky Tuber-

Nearly three-fourths of all new cases of tuberculosis in Kentucky are being discovered through these mass x-ray survey programs. The units tour throughout the state and approximately 300,000 persons get chest x-rays annually under the program.



Persons under fifteen years are x-rayed only if they are known to have been in direct contact with persons who have tuberculosis or upon a physician's referral. The tuberculosis case rate among this younger group is quite low. All teachers and food handlers are required to have an x-ray made


