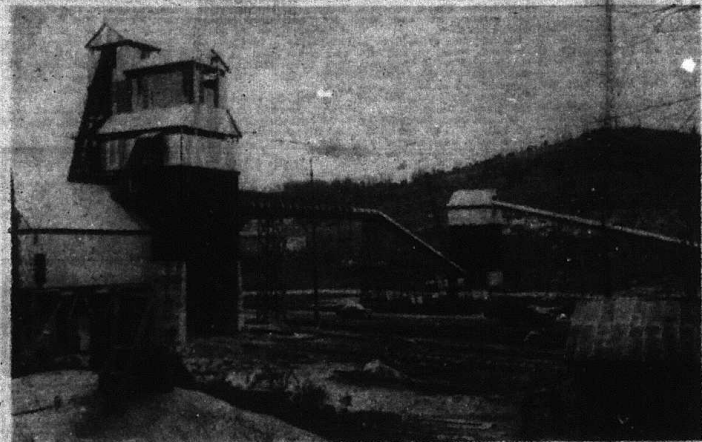

## Stone Company Opens New Plant Here

The new plant of the Kentucky Stone Co. at Mt. Vernon went into operation yesterday, constituting an investment for the company of about \$200,000. The new plant is across U. S. 150 and the Louisville & Nashville Railroad from the old site. But the crusher at the old site and other machinery will continue to be used. The most unusual feature at the quarry is the conveyor over the highway and railroad which will bring rock from the new site on the south side to the crusher on the north side. The capacity of the new plant is about 150 tons an hour. The new plant will employ from 15 to 20 persons, including the supervision force. The company does not plan to hire additional men for the new plant.

## R. B. Bird Takes Post On Court Of Appeals

A former Mt. Vernon attorney will take his place on the Court of Appeals at Frankfort, Jan. 7. Robert B. Bird, 52, Republican, Leitchville, a native of Williamsburg, will become the 111th person in the history of Kentucky to assume the role of judge of the state's highest court. Bird, who will represent the Seventh Appellate District on the Court, defeated Democratic incumbent Arthur Hogg in recent election. Judge Bird graduated from Cumberland College, Williamsburg, and the University of Kentucky College of Law. Upon graduation from college, he located at Mt. Vernon and in 1937 was elected Rockcastle county attorney. During the administration of Gov. Simon Willis, he served as general counsel for the State General Employment Commission. He is married and has a daughter, Miss Barbara Jo Bird, a student at Georgetown College. He is a son of J. C. Bird, Williamsburg attorney, who served as commissioner of public institutions, now the Welfare Department, during the administration of Gov. Sappington.

## Local Polio Group Gets \$700 Check To Bolster Funds

A check for \$700, received by the Rockcastle County Chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, will help provide financial aid for local patients, it was announced today by Mr. Earl Mayhew, chapter chairman.

The check was sent because local chapter funds have been depleted this year, mainly in the care of the County's one new polio patient of the year, Edith Res. Ponder, of Conway.

Despite receipt of this check from national headquarters to supplement our own March of Dimes funds, it is anticipated the chapter will carry bills totaling over \$100.00 over into 1957. Funds to pay these bills will have to be raised by the March of Dimes this month.

"We had hoped next national headquarters would be able to advance us enough money to meet all our 1956 bills," Mrs. Mayhew said. "However, and to chapter for polio patients, amounting to \$4,700.00, has exhausted the funds available for this purpose."

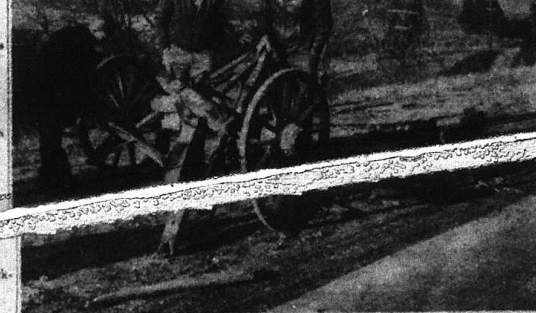
