He also wrote: "Certainly in this day of inflation, of unbalanced budgets, of installment buying, there is a need for knowledge of other peoples, a knowledge not gained for homerrow, we must have a knowledge of the history of our past, not to be gasined from learning to drive a car. Who caused this trend? We suspect, it can be laid at the feet of one John Dewey, the so-called father of modern and "progressive education." At least, we, know of no teacher's college in America that has not made his writings the Bible of their educational program. It is interesting to note', Europeans never "took" to Dewey's philosophy and methods, and never copied him. As one European educator once remarked: "Teach the student how to read, write and figure and get him interested in the three subjects, and hell progress."

The point is', however, is is now unnecessary to blame any educator today. It is necessary to begin the 'remedy. Perhaps through the increased educational appropriation Congress no doubt will pass, lies the answer. If the money is actually used to encourage science, mathematics, history, reading, writing and the arts, and not emphasize so strongly driving and repairing autos and selecting TV programs. In short, we may get (and we'd like to see) a tight, compusiory academic curriculum. There are other remedies, in a broad sense, that we believe will be helpful: (1) the encouragement of students into fields of academic learning (2) the separation in the public schools of the vocational curriculum from the academic curriculum until grade 10; then let the student decide if he wants an academic or vocational diploma (3) encourage the student to think for him.

They should not be allowed to wreck our school system by forcing opto overloaded teachers the job nature intended for parents. It is high time the Moms and Pops took back the burden of training and discipline that it rightly theirs. Then the teacher would have a chance to do a better job of teaching the children in her class their reading, writing and arithmetic. She is trying to do far too many things now, and it should be no surprise if she does them all badly."
