## DAIRYING PROMOTED BY BUSINESS MEN

In 1948 a survey was made of the farming situation in Rockcastle County by Vocational Agriculture teachers and veterans of Rockcastle County. They found a total of 232 dairy animals and 135 bulls, (The half bull was owned by Berea College and a resident of the Bone community.)

At that time there was not a single milk route operating in Rockcastle County. Through the combined efforts of all County Agricultural agencies two milk routes were developed in late 1949.

1949: Since the starting of the first milk routes, some six milk companies have bought fluid milk in the county and dairy animals have increased from 231½ to over 1,1000.

Several hundred of these animals were bought in Wisconsin, Ohio and other dairy areas by Agricultural personnel.

Since Rockcastle County has the type land that must be

devoted to pasture and hay crops, small farms and an abundance of labor, dairying was the logical choice for efficient management of this type farm. Many farmers have been able to triple their gross income through better pastures, hay crops and high producing dairy

cows.

With good foundation cows purchased and the opportunity to breed these cows, artificially, to the best bulls in the United States, rapid progress has been made in the number of cows and

Rockcastle is one of few counties able to boast two artificial Rockcastle.is one of few counties able to boast two artificial breeding services. Bulls valued at many times over \$15,500 are made available to small and large dairy farmers. The American Breeders company artificial breeding service-is managed by K. R. Burdette, velgrinarian. The Kentucky Cooperative Association service is managed by Wayne Adams.

The Rockcastle County Development Association has recognized.

ized the importance of the dairy industry in the country and de-cided to promote the industry in any way they can. It has been estimated that the \$1,000.000 dairy industry in the country can triple in the next few years, if everyone joins forces and works

The business men have gotten behind the dairy enterprise The business men have gotten bening in early enterprise with the idea of developing "what we have at hand" and then hoping that industry will want to come to us.

Even if no industry should come, if the dairy enterprise makes pregress the photect will have been a success.
