

The shape of things to come trafficwise during 1961 was "brought home" to residents-of the county early Monday in the tragic deaths of the Rev. H. B. Harris and his daughter, Elizabeth, 17, of Waco, in an auto, accident north of Mt. Vernon. Their untimely deaths were the first of the year for Rock-castle County, but before the year is out it is predicted that at least 16, perhaps 20, persons will have lost their lives on county

It is estimated that a million more motorists will be on the nation's highways this year than last, and no doubt U.S. 25 and U.S. 150-will, see a sizeable increase. With this increase in traffic on our narrow north-south-highways comes an increase in the likelihood and prevalency of accidents.

For the most part, county citizens appear to have learned and control of the county citizens appear to have learned that any of the highways. At least we have not had a great number of serious accidents in which local people were involved. But this of course may not be the case this year.

We have been told that during 1961 there will be a general tightening up of traffic law enforcement by state and local police. This, coupled with caution and common sense in driving, will go a long way in making state highways safer for citizens and visitors.

No matter where you drive this year, drive with care. Be courteous, cooperative, cautious, and stay alive.
