Purgation Notice

The Purgation Board of Rockcastle County met on Nov. 13 and checked all the Election Books. They took out all the cards of persons that had not voted in the past two years, all cards of persons that had married and needed to change their names and all cards of persons that had moved and needed to change their voting precincts.

Notices were sent to all these persons so that they would have time to come in before the Purgation Board and have their cards corrected or to re-register.

The names of all persons that had moved away or for some other reason did not get their notices are being published so that they might go to the County Clerk's Office and register before the May Primary in 1962.

If you are not registered or if your name appears in this list, you must register by March 31, 1962 to be eligible to vote in the May 29th 1962 Primary Election.

Anyone that will be 18 years of age by November 6, 1962 is eligible to register and vote in the May Primary, providing he has resided at least a year in the State of Kentucky, 6 months in Rockcastle County and at least 60 days in their precinct.
