

Mr. Nunnelley explains the problem in this way:

"One of the major problems the hospital is faced with today is the patient census which averaged 9,6 patients per day in 1962, or a 40 percent occupancy. Estimates obtained from other hospitals indicate in order for a hospital to operate in the red the occupancy must be at 80 percent, 20 patients per day."

In this statement lies a great problem—a problem that will not be easy for the hospital is nown or of these cases, the illness could have been as easily remedied, and less expensively, at the Rockcastle hospital as in another hospital. Take from the current usage figures the number of persons who are hospitalized from injuries, who live in other locales and states, and the local patronage becomes even less.

Obviously, the low use rate is caused by many and diverse reasons, but in almost every case the reasons why loverse reasons, but in almost every case the reasons why loverse complex more of the hospital facilities and repronnel.

The second problem is even more complex, more demanding and basically a matter of dollars and cents.

In order for any hospital, or business, to operate successfully it is necessary for the patients to pay their bills—in short, collections.

Mr. Nunnelley discusses the problem in this way:

"Not only does a hospital have to have 80 percent occupancy, a hospital must also collect 80 percent of companies, and the state of the searned income. For the past five years of operation, our hospital averaged less than 50 percent occupancy and collected only 50 to 60 percent of its carred income from patients. 
