## Now Is The Time To Act

With the bids for the construction of a new Courthouse for Rockcastle County to be opened in a few days, another big problem has arisen that could affect the County for generations to come, and that is: the acquisition of land on which to build two lakes near Mt. Vernon.

As we sit here trying to picture in our minds how these lakes would affect Rockcastle, we see a group of men with blueprints in their hands looking over the Courthouse and making plans to put in a bid for construction of the new Courthouse and Jail. We wonder if the plans for construction of the two lakes will be carried out.

We would like to commend Judge Charles Carter and the Fiscal Court for going ahead with the construction of the Courthouse-Jail, even though the voted bond issue fell a few votes short of the two-thirds majority.

As the construction of Interstate 75 starts through Rockcastle County we would like to see the lakes being built. Just what would this mean to our County?

When this super highway is finished between Mt. Vernon and Richmond it will be only a 45 minute drive to Lexington. With the population of Lexington growing so fast that the children of school age have to attend classes in shifts, some getting home late at night, parents are going to be looking for a place to build new homes. With Rockcastle located in the foothills of Eastern Kentucky, on a beautiful lake, what more would we need, when they could drive to Lexington practically as soon as they could drive across town.

As far as industry is concerned, it would only be a matter of time until someone would locate here with such a water supply available. Property value would increase. With the flooding of Renfro Creek stopped the property below the dam would be worth much more.

Tourists would flow off Interstate 75 to this lake until it would look like old times in Renfro Valley and Mt. Vernon, when tourists flooded all accommodations.

If such a lake were built, this certainly would give Renfro Valley the go-ahead to expand. They would not have to consider a move to another town.

As we see it, now is the time to act. The whole population of the United States is centering around vacations and recreation. All the unions are working for a 35 hour work week. What will they do with their spare time? Recreation seems to be the answer.

It is hoped that the property owners will get-together soon and organize and appoint a committee to speak for them and make the land available for these leaders.

While we are writing this editorial, word comes from the officials of Brodhead that their water supply has reached a critical stage and they ask water users to use water sparingly.

If the proposed lake were built, both Brodhead and Mt. Vernon could pump water from the lake. Mt. Vernon would only have a short distance to lay pipe to put the water into their present pumping system. This could be done much cheaper than having the present lake cleaned.
