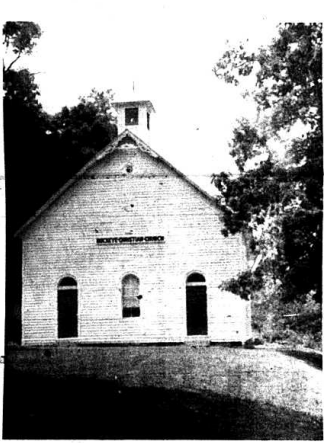

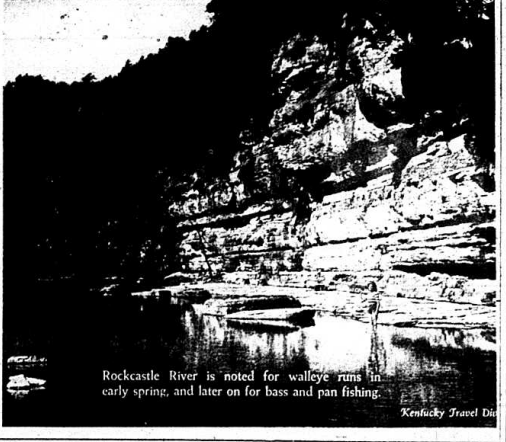
**Kentucky Needs More Nuts For Planting**

Kentucky needs more nuts, and the State Department of Natural Resources will be happy to pay for them.

The kind trees of interest in grow on trees—Black walnuts, acorns, pine cones or bark yellow poplar, etc. The seeds are needed for planting in the Division of Forestry's three tree seedling nurseries which annually produce 16 million seedlings used in reforestation.

A tree seed improvement program is now under way to provide high quality seeds, and develop new nut and variety, especially for Kentucky. By 1965 the seed orchards reach full development. The State will have its own seeds locally, in keeping with the demand in the nursery.

State district foresters should be contacted for information on how much and what kind of seeds are in demand.
