Anti-Poverty Program Proposed By Shepherd

DOCTOR TELLS 20-COUNTY IDEA

A "war-on-poverty" program covering a three-year period was submitted last week to the office of Sargent Shriver, director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, Washington, by Dr. M. A. Shepherd, director of the State Health Department, at Somerset.

The program is expected to cost about \$1,883,614 and cover a 20-county area in South Central Kentucky, including Rockcastle.

At a recent District dinner meeting of the "Kentucky Welfare Association" at "Retro Valley Lodge," and attended by about 75 persons, Mrs. Shepherd, regional director, reported the program as outlined by Dr. Shepherd.

ASC Tobacco Forms Ready

Applications for 1965 new grower tobacco allotments in Rockcastle are now being accepted in all ASCS County offices, according to an announcement made by Mr. R. O. Wilson, Chairman of the ASCS State Committee.

The Chairman pointed out that in order to qualify for a new grower tobacco allotment (Burley, Dark Air-cured, or Fire-cured), all of the following requirements must be met: The applicant must:

- (1) Have had at least two years' experience within the last 5 years (1960-64) in growing the type of tobacco requested in the application as owner, operator, share-tenant, or cash renter; Tobacco produced on a farm that had no acreage allotment will not be considered for experience.
- (2) Own the farm.
- (3) Operate the farm.
- (4) The farm must not have a 1965 allotment established for any kind of tobacco at the time the application is filed.
- (5) Obtain, during 1965, more than 50 percent of his income from the production of agricultural commodities or products from the farm for which the new farm allotment application is filed.
- (6) Obtain, during 1965, the value of all crops and gardens produced on the farm, as well as the value of livestock and livestock products sold from or consumed on the farm, must be greater than the income from all sources away from the farm for which the application is being filed. No credit will be allowed for the value of livestock kept on the farm.

from the staff of the health department. He will consult frequently with professionals in all community agencies, including education, welfare, agriculture and existing service groups so as to provide the comprehensive approach so necessary in achieving broad scale usage of all these important resources to upgrade family standards. Mrs. Hunt said.

The home front worker must be present of the community in which he works and a product of a like environment, he said. He must possess unquestionable character, high intelligence, a congenial personality and a high school education, the health officer noted. An outsider would perhaps work only a few months outside his training, whereas a local person would become a permanent asset in the community, she declared.

She reported there will be administrative and supervisor staff hired for the project. The office will be closely associated with the Somerset Region's Health Office of the State Department to facilitate the coordination of the work of this project with that of the state and local health departments. There are already within the area 43 public health nurses, 23 sanitarians, four nutritionists and eight public

health physicians who will provide professional public health services at the "home front" level when the health department has established a working relationship there and these services thus become wanted, accepted and used effectively by the recipients.
