

### SEAL DRIVE COMING SOON

The 1935 Easter Seals Campaign, for the benefit of thousands of crippled children in Kentucky, will be held March 1 through April 18, Easter Sunday, according to Mrs. Jack Lewis, Rockcastle chairman.

Funds raised in the annual appeal sponsored by the Kentucky Society for Crippled Children help support a statewide program of services, ranging from hospitalizations and out-patient therapy to summer camping at the state's only resident camp for the physically handicapped.

This year 450,000 letters containing Easter Seals will be mailed to residents in all 120 Kentucky counties, in addition to the mail appeal, volunteer workers throughout the state plan to hold special visits to support the Society's programs.

"This year's appeal is one of the most important in the 42 year history of the Kentucky Society for Crippled Children," Dr. Kelly Thompson, Bowling Green, state campaign chairman, said. "The reason is as simple as this—the number of crippled children and adults increases every year, and in direct ratio, so does the need for more money to give them care and treatment."

Last year the Society served 3559 Kentuckians—3180 of whom were children, reported Dr. Thompson.

"They included accident victims, children with birth defects, and those who had been disabled by such diseases as polio and cerebral palsy," he said. "No other private agency in Kentucky provides so wide a program for those crippled by so many causes."

Dr. Thompson, who headed the drive last year, is president of Western Kentucky State College.

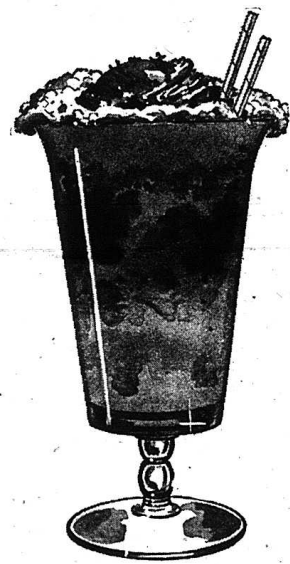
