



There is no requirement for any education, 4 think the people of this county as well as the state want someone with more than just the bare essentials to be their coroner.

I am asking that you alect me your coroner for the next four years, I am 28 years old, in good health and able to go where ever and whenever I am called When time comes to appoint a deputy I will appoint a person who is a Republican and not one who changed politics to be appointed deputy.

So I say that I want to be coroner for the quali-fications that I think I have over my opponents. Here is my oath to the voters of Rockcastle County:

"If elected to the office of Coroner of Rock-castle County, I swear to perform the duties to the best of my ability. To go when I am called and to thoroughly investigate any death where there is suspicion of foul play or death from any unknown


