Dear Friend And Voter:







To The Citizen's And Voters Of Rockcastle County

This will be my last appeal to you by the media of fithe press before election day. For the past several weeks I have been meeting and talking with you good citizens about the issues of this compaign and the problems of our county. I have not writed until the elevanth hour to tell you where I stand and what you can ex that the campaign is drawing to a close, will my opponents make a feeble effort to tell you what they stand for?

This has been a clean campaign. I have presented the facts to you. What I have said about my appanents was either taken from their own words or from the record. They have had ample time to refute these statements if they were not true. Their silence is an admission of the truthfulness of the things you and I have talked about.

Our present County Judge will try to make you believe that our State Police are a law violating group, that they disboey the low. Very well, if they do, then why has he not used his delegated outhority as County Judge to convict them for-this violation?

A candidate for State Police office must be a young man who is honest and of moral character above reproach. We who have been fortunate enough to have these young man and their families as our neighbors during the past years and to know that they have given our school buses and we critisens the protection we have so much needed and enjoyed, on our head traveled highways sodly miss them. We can no longer drive our highways with safety. When our children leave home each morning to board a school bus we cannot feel as secure about their safety os we formerly could.

You will no doubt be told that patroling our highways is the sole duty of the Sheriff's office. As I stated before, the Sheriff's office is numerically too few in number to provide this protection. One of them must read in the office at all times to take care of the duties there. This leaves only two to patrol hundreds of miles of both county and state highways and to provide other necessary protection to our clitzens. As your next County Judge, I will get this police protection restored to the county and I will cooperate will all lave neforcing agencies of our county. This could save the lives of many of our citizens.

During the past four years our county lost several thousand dollars in tax money due to the fact that we had to return-several pieces of road machinery to the manufacturers that we were unable to pay for. Our present county judge is telling you that he was responsible for a \$125,000 bridge over Roundstone Creek at Orlando, that he was responsible for getting twenty-seven miles of blacktop and twelve miles of new grade work

when every voter in the county knows that all these projects were strickly state road projects, independent of any county office or influence whatso-ever. When you ask our county judge for a load of gravel to fill a mad hole on a county road to you can get to and from your home he will say, "You'll have to see your Mogistrate."

You are being told that the new courthouse will cost you nothing extro. We are told that we receive about \$6,500.00 per year rent for office space. That we save abtu \$2,700.00 per year that we paid as rent for the health department, the welfare department, the bookmobile and the country agent, and that we have a surplus of about \$6,000.00 per year for a grand total \$15,200.00. This, you are being stold, will take care of the courthouse bonds. Now friends, what you are not being told is that the interest alone on this \$400,000.00 debt will be for in excess of the \$15,200.00 that we are told we will have each year to pay on this indebtedness. Since we would have \$6,000.00 surplus anyway, we then actually have only \$9,200.00 extra to pay on these bonds. So it will be impossible to pay off this indebtedness in the time alloted with this amount of money. Talk about this costing you nothing extra, why friends, you can't even go to the rest rooms in our courthouse, that you will not have to pay for, to take care of your personal eneeds without it costing you. When I am elected as your next county judge the locks will be taken from the rest room doors.

Crime is on the increase in our notion. Crime is being committed in Rockcastle County. As Police Judge of Mt. Vernon, I wish I could stop crime, but no individual nor group of individuals can do this. We may check crime but we cannot stop if. The duty of a police judge is to deal with a criminal according to due process of law ofter he has been apprehended and the proper charges are brought against him. This I have done to the best of my ability, and will continue to do ofter I am elected as your next County Judge.
