

DEFINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY
PROPOSED TO BE ANMEXED TO THE PRESENT
CITY BOUNDARY.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT VER-NON, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


