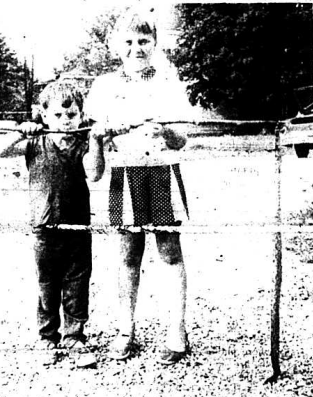

The election by mail of Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation community committeemen is under-

way. The Chairman of the Rockcastle County ASC Committee, Willie Lamb, said ballots have been mailed to all known eligible farm voters.

The ballots should be mailed or taken to the county ASC office on or before September 19. They will be counted on September 23 at a meeting open to the public.

To aid the County ASC Committee in the administration of farm programs, the county is divided into five agricultural communities. Farm voters in each community will elect three community committeemen and two alternates.

Chairman Willie Lamb said any person with a

farm interest — as owner, operator, tenant, or sharecropper — is probably eligible to vote. If a farmer does not receive a ballot, he should call the Rockcastle ASC County Office to find out if he is eligible to vote and to request a ballot.

Chairman Willie Lamb reminded farmers that ballots must be received in the county ASC office on or before September 19, 1969.

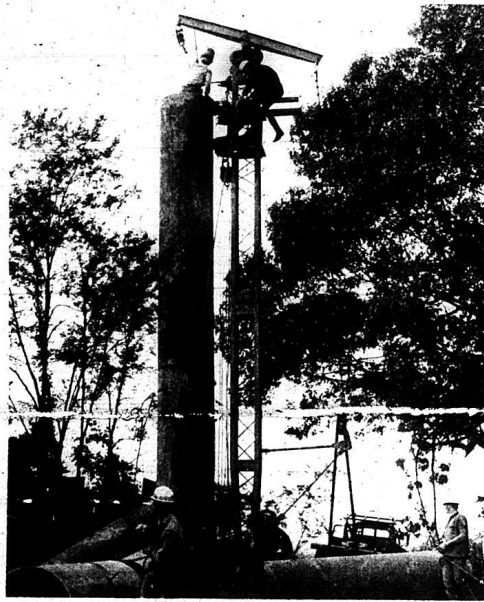

School Enrollment Up In County

Rockcastle County Schools opened Tuesday, August 26 with an enrollment of 3,238 students which is an increase of 98 students over last year's enrollment of 3,140. Three additional teachers were required to take care of this increase.

Enrollment figures in the consolidated county schools are as follows: Brodhead High School 278; Brodhead Elementary 832; Mt. Vernon High School 373; Mt. Vernon Elementary 505; Livingston High School 228, and Livingston Elementary 363.

In the rural schools, the enrollment is as follows: Roundstone 374; Maple Grove 134; Blue Springs 60; Sand Springs 48; Clay 34; Cove 21; Owen

Allen 20; Johnetta 19; Red Hill 19; Well Hope 16, and Cave Ridge 14.

The vocational school has enrolled 140 students. Berea High School is expected to send about 30 students when their school term opens September 22. Livingston and Berea students are attending in the morning while Brodhead and Mt. Vernon students attend in the afternoon.

There are a total of 37 enrolled in auto mechanics, 23 in welding, 12 in electricity, 7 in radio and T.V. repair, and 56 in business and office. School officials hope to fill all classes with students and some adults who can attend during the day.

Delta Natural Gas Buys City Franchise

The Mount Vernon City Council, at its regular meeting on Thursday September 4, 1969, voted unanimously to accept the bid for a natural gas franchise submitted by the Delta Natural Gas Company of Winchester, Kentucky. Delta presently serves the community of Berea, Kentucky and environs, approximately 14 miles north of this city.

A Delta Spokesman attending the meeting and explained the necessary procedure involved relating to construction of a natural gas distribution system for the City of Mount Vernon. He stated that preliminary engineering would be done in the

very near future to determine whether or not the project will be feasible at this time. In the event that the project is feasible, negotiations would be begun to obtain a natural gas supply from one of the major pipelines running through Garrard County and Lincoln County to the northwest of the city. He further stated that presently, there may be a shortage of supply.

In the event the engineering report indicates it is not practical for Delta to construct the gas system and a suitable supply may be obtained, it would take, approximately nine months to one year to construct transmission facilities and distribution facilities.

Vocational School; Auto Mechanics Dept.

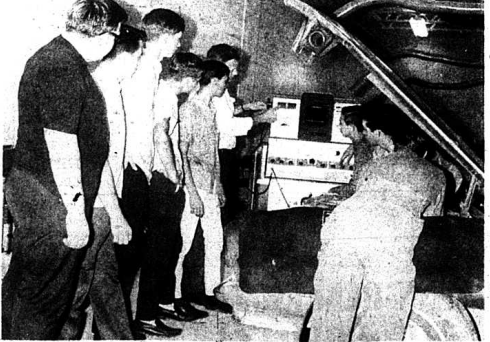

Social Security News

"Farm household workers who fail to give their Social Security numbers to their employers may lose a part of all of the Social Security payment which may be due when the time comes to claim them." This warning comes from James Mustian manager of the Somerset Social Security district office.

Mustian pointed out the Social Security account number is the key to the worker's social security record. It identifies his record from all others. Social Security benefit payments are based on earnings. If a worker's

social security number is missing from the earnings report filed on his behalf by his employer, he gets no credit for his wages. That can mean a money loss to him and his family at a time when it may be needed most.

Household work on a farm is covered by Social Security if the employee is paid at least \$150 in cash wages in a year, or if the employee works for some part of 20 days on a time basis. The employer is required to report these earnings to the Internal Revenue Service for social security purposes.

The worker should make sure that the employer has the correct Social Security number. The best plan is to give this number to the employer the first day the employee goes to work on a new job. Mustian said.

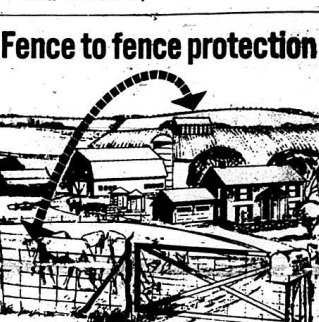
