One company one company used a window envelope that was almost identical to the

envelopes social security uses to send our benefit checks, Mustian remark-ed. He went on to say that only careful reading of the fine print in the advertisement revealed the statement that the company was "not an agency of the state or

the statement that the company was "not an agency of the state or federal government."

Mustians stressed that the social security administration does not endorse. dorse any privately-sponsored insurance plan designed to "supplement medicare benefits." He also emphasized private insurance com-panies do not have access to social security rec-ords, which are confiden-
