S&W loans have a 5% interest rate and a maximum repayment period of 40 years. S&W loan funds are usually requested for farm and home water supplies, feening, and basic land treatment such as liming, fertilizer, and seeding to establish permanent pastures. Loan funds can also be used for draining wet land, forestry, fish farming, and waste pollution abstement estate improvements, with the exception of buildings, qualify as an authorized loan purpose.

of buildings, qualify as an authorized loan purpose. Eligibility for loans is established by a committee of 3 persons who know local farming and credit conditions. Basic eligibility requirements include the applicant's inability to get sufficient credit elsewhere on terms he can meet and not having available resources of his own.




