Legislative Report

LRC) conducts research into areas

the 1978 General Assembly passed 33 separate resolutions calling for studies, surveys and analyses to be made on various topies during the interim. Estimated cost of these 33 studies will result in an expenditure of 3800,000 in state funds. Brief descriptions of six resolutions are as follows. Senate Concurrent Resolution 33, directs the Council on Higher Education in conjunction with the LRG and the General Assembly to conduct a study of

the status of federally funded research and development in Kentucky. All-burnoved in the study will be the Kentucky Academy of Science. Kentucky ranks low among other states in receiving federal funds for research and development, and the study is to determine the cause of this. The estimated cost of this research is \$10,000.

\$10,000.

House Joint Resolution 61, allows the creation of a special LRC subcommittee to study the low percentage of admissions of rural Kentuckians to professional schools. The subcommittee -shall be-composed of eleven members. Seven members will come from the Genral Assembly; four

from rural communities, appointed by the IRC. Three members will be dean of Kentucky professional schools; one-from meelicine, one from dentistry, and one from law. The eleventh members will be the Director of the Council of Higher Education. The estimated cost of the study is \$12,000.

Senate Joint Resolution 21 directs the LRC through the Interim Joint Committee on Education to study the needs of dyslexic children. \$10,000 was appropriated to the LRC for the stidy. House Concurrent Resolution 67, directs the LRC staff of the Education committee to study the education reorgans for exceptional children and vocational education. The study will

include a description of how services are presently provided and their costs; statutory, regulatory and judical requirements; how well the need is being met, and an assessment of the adequacy of financing. The estimated cost of the study is \$24,000.

House Concurrent Resolution 73, directs the LRC to study the Kentucky Revised Statutes relating to election recounts and election contests for the purpose of developing consistency and darity in the procedures for conducting recounts and contested-elections. The estimated cost of the study is \$12,000.

House Concurrent Resolution 116, directs the LRC to study the feasibility of establishing a hunter safety certification program; the program would require anyone under 16 years old or anyone seeking hunting licenses for anyone seeking hunting licenses for anyone seeking hunting lacety. The estimated cost of the study is \$8,000.

The resolutions I have just described are among the most inexpensive to initiate. There are studies to be conducted which will run from \$100,000 to \$200,000 individually. Next week, it is my intention to discuss the big money research projects.


