## PUBLIC NOTICE

The State Bureau of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement will hold a series of public meetings to obtain public comments on the draft proposal of Kentucky's permanent surface mining regulations and program plan.

The draft regulations must be submitted to the U.S. Office of Surface Mining by August 3, 1979. ## THE SHOCKING FACTS

The shock of your life could occur in your kitchen unless you're aware of safety practices. To avoid a jolt when working in the kitchen, heed these hints from the Consumer Information Department of Corning Glass Works.

1. Don't use electric appliances while standing in water, touching plumbing fixtures or any other metal objects.
2. Keep all electrical equipment away from the sink where extra cord length may dangle into a water-filled sink.
3. Don't overload outlets. Always unplug appliances when they are not in use and when they are being cleaned. Likewise, when an appliance has a detachable cord, unplug it at the wall outlet first.

### 30 From Here Tour Virginia As Part of Annual Agri-Business Tour

Fifteen couples from Rockcastle County went to Virginia last week as part of the tenth annual Agri-Business Tour. The four-day trip was highlighted by visits to historic spots and an all-day tour of the Virginia Polytechnic Institute's Animal Science Research Unit and Farm at Catawba.

At the Institute, the group saw farms where researchers are studying sheep, hogs, cattle and horses, using such experimental projects as solar-heated farrowing units on the swine farms.

The group also stopped in Washington County, Va., and studied the tobacco, dairy, beef and poultry operations there, and Paramount Ranches, where its manager demonstrated methods of handling cattle.

Among the historic sites on the agenda were Monticello, home of Thomas Jefferson; Appomattox, where the surrender of Gen. Lee to Gen. Grant took place at the end of the Civil War; and Petersburg National Battlefield Park, site of a Civil War battle.

The restored colonial village of Williamsburg and the Newport News shipyard, largest in the world, were other places the group visited.

## State Receipts Exceed Estimates

Inflation and full employment have caused state government revenues to slightly exceed estimates for the 1978-79 fiscal year, according to Maurice Carpenter, commissioner of revenue.

General fund receipts for the fiscal year ending June 30 were \$1,698,527,239. The receipt figure is \$6 million over the revised January estimate.

Contributing to revenue excess with the individual income taxes collection totaling \$456.2 million, which was 1.4 percent over projections. Carpenter said he expects the income tax receipts to continue growing as a result of inflation.

Carpenter said the revenue receipts indicate Kentucky still has a healthy economy, although recent trends in the sale and motor fuel taxes could cause problems.

The sales tax and the motor fuel taxes have suffered from a slower growth rate than expected during the last two months, Carpenter said.

Carpenter blamed the decrease in fuel tax collections on gas allocations policies.

High gasoline prices have also hurt the sales tax, which was \$599.2 million-1.8 percent below the \$610 million.

"When people don't drive, they don't shop and spend money," according to Carpenter. "More of the family budget is spent on gasoline, so fewer purchases of other products lessens sales tax collection," he said.

Corporation income tax receipts of \$163.3 million indicated a strong showing, but corporation taxes are difficult to predict accurately, Carpenter said.

revenue from the coal severance tax, according to Carpenter. Coal taxes of \$139 million were 4.6 percent above projections.

National economic and energy policies are very important to tax revenues, Carpenter said. "A federal policy encouraging more coal production would be a shot in the arm to Kentucky," he emphasized.

Recent trends in sales and fuel taxes will be considered in the revised estimates for the 1979-80 fiscal year. Carpenter said the projections will be ready for the legislature and the governor within the next month.

## Alcohol Statistics

A "typical" young drinker in one East Texas county takes his or her first drink at age 10, in five years has consumed alcohol on at least eight occasions, and prefers to drink with friends.

According to the poll, 69 percent of the respondents had experimented with alcohol before 12th grade; 71 percent of these had taken a drink before age 12.

The majority-45 percent-had

their first drink in the presence of a parent, while 30 percent drank with a friend. But those who continued drinking favored drinking with friends.

Half the time, beer was the drink of choice, with wine and hard liquor second and third in popularity. Sixty-eight percent said their drinking was done in a home.

Do these students feel a legal drinking age is necessary? Eighty-five percent of the respondents said yes. The question of what the age should be got a variety of responses: 30 percent, lower than 18 years of age; 41 percent over 18; 29 percent, over 21.

## Five Young Brodhead Residents Killed in One-Vehicle Accident

Five young people were killed early Thursday in Brodhead in a one-car accident on US 150, a sixth highway death occurred Friday night on I-75 six miles south of Mt. Vernon, bringing the total number of fatalities to 14 since January in Rockcastle County.

The five who died Thursday were Kenneth Rose, 26; Susan Cass, 21; Timothy Bishop, 21; Johnny D. York, 21; and Gwen Carey, 17. All were residents of Brodhead.

The accident occurred about 12:30 a.m. between Benge's Standard Station and Simpson Feed Mills, where the road curves to the right. According to state trooper Jack Lawless, who arrived at the scene at 12:35, the car missed the curve, knocked over three wooden posts about 10 inches in diameter, and skidded in the brush and trees before it hit a dirt embankment. It hit the embankment at such tremendous force that the automobile flipped over several times and travelled 17 feet in the air before landing upside down near the railroad tracks.

Officer Lawless said he did not know how many times the car flipped over, but that four of the victims had probably been thrown from the vehicle's windows upon impact. It had not been raining, he said, and the roads were dry. He found no evidence of drugs, although there were some beer cans in the wreckage.

The automobile, a 1974 Pontiac Gran Prix, belonged to Kenneth

Rose, who was apparently driving at the time. The group had been to a rock concert in Lexington according to Kenneth's brother, Ted Rose. It was the 21st birthday of Johnnie York.

Officer Lawless said that the car was travelling at a high rate of speed, but he did not know exactly how fast it was going. An expert from the National Transportation

## Rabid Skunks Killed at Negro Creek and Renfro, County's Total Goes to Five So Far This Year

Two more cases of rabies have been confirmed in Rockcastle County this week, bringing the total to five in areas throughout the county.

One case was a skunk killed by David Blanton in the Negro Creek area, the first confirmation of the disease in that area. Mr. Blanton killed the animal July 12, and it was tested the following day.

The other case was confirmed in Renfro Valley July 2, when C.F. Holt was bitten in his own backyard by a fox confirmed later to have been rabid. Mr. Holt has had to undergo a series of painful shots which is the only known treatment for the disease.

The other cases of rabies were two on Old Brodhead Road near Mt. Vernon, and one at Willailla. Steve Midkiff, environmentalist with the Rockcastle County Health Department, said that people live in the areas of confirmed cases may want to voluntarily quarantine their domestic animals as a precaution.

The Health Department has not called for a quarantine of dogs. Some counties, including Madison and Boyle, have taken this step.

Mr. Midkiff said that people should avoid contact with any wild animals that are acting strangely—such as showing no fear of humans or appearing in daylight when they are ordinarily night creatures.

Any skunks killed for rabies testing must have the bodies removed. The head only is tested and it must not be damaged.

According to a report released this week by the national Center for Disease Control, the total number of rabies cases in the United States this year is double that of last year. There have been 2430 cases reported so far.

The problem is particularly bad near the Texas-Mexico border, where there have been six recent cases of rabies in humans, resulting in the deaths of three children.

## Legislative Report

By Rep. Harold DeMarcus

During the interim periods between legislative sessions, the General Assembly forms into seventy-two standing committees, subcommittees and special committees. These interim committees operate under authority sanctioned by the Legislative Research Commission (LRC).

The LRC is a sixteen member committee chaired by the Speaker of the House and comprised of the bipartisan leadership officers of both the House and Senate.

LRC met on June the 29th to conduct business pertaining to several legislative situations.

It was reported to the commission that a total of 796 information requests were received by members of the LRC staff during the month of May 1979. There were 195 miscellaneous requests, 37 requests from the LRC Library, 33 requests from the public bill room, 273 requests for LRC publications and 258 requests for LRC research reports and information bulletins.

The commission voted to authorize a \$6,000 personal service contract for the appropriations and Revenue Committee (A&R) to pay an economist to provide independent revenue estimates and other economic analysis. The economist has been used by A&R for the last four years to provide independent economic statistics used in the preparation of the state executive budget.

The personal service contract review subcommittee reported to LRC that during their one year existence they have succeeded in cancelling or reducing thirteen separate contracts. The financial savings to the Commonwealth provided by the subcommittee's actions total \$1,027,942.

LRC voted to grant the program review and investigations committee permission to proceed

with three in-depth studies. The studies will involve investigations into the policies of out-of-state travel by state employees; the bureau for the blind, especially its administrative costs, and service delivery performance; and the real estate education, research and recovery fund administered by the Kentucky Real Estate Commission.

The chairman of the Interim Joint Committee on Health and Welfare requested LRC to form a subcommittee to study the state's emergency medical services. LRC in turn authorized the appointment of a Health and Welfare subcommittee on emergency medical services which will be comprised of four senators and three representatives.

LRC received a report from the Business Organizations and Professions Committee on the distilling industry in Kentucky with a request that the situation be studied. It seems that in recent years the number of distilleries in Kentucky has dropped from 59 to 17 and there are indications that the ad valorem tax on distilled spirits is the primary reason. LRC voted to study this situation but as yet it has not been determined which committee will conduct the study.

Also, LRC received and is still contemplating a set of rules and guidelines submitted by the Business Organizations and Professions Committee for the review of new licensing proposals. A recent study by the U.S. Department of Labor shows that more than 900 occupations make requests for licensing. During the 1978 session of the Kentucky General Assembly, there were 21 bills introduced to license occupations. So it does appear that some procedure for licensing professions in Kentucky must be established.

LRC received a monthly financial report from the State Department of Finance detailing the number of personal service contracts in effect, the general fund balance sheet, transportation fund balance sheet and a statement of cash by funds and depositaries. LRC has scheduled its next meeting for the first Friday in August.

**Making Apple Butter**

Here's a good recipe for making about 5 pints of apple butter. Good cooking apples make the best apple butter.

- 6 pounds apples (about 24)
- 2 quarts apple juice
- 3 cups sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves

Wash and slice apples. Add juice and cook until tender. Press through a sieve or food mill to remove skins and seeds. Measure out 3 quarts of apple pulp and cook until thick enough to round up on a spoon. As pulp thickens, stir frequently to prevent sticking. Add sugar and spices. Cook slowly, stirring often, until thick—about 1 hour.

Pour hot into hot, clean pint jars. Leave 1/4 inch headspace. Seal and process for 10 minutes in boiling-water-bath canner.

**Freezing Pears**

Select well-ripened firm pears, but not hard ones. Wash, peel, cut into halves or quarters and remove cores. Heat pears in boiling 30 to 40 percent syrup for 1 to 2 minutes, depending on size of pieces. Drain and cool.

Pack into containers and cover with cold syrup. For a better product, add 1/4 teaspoon crystalline ascorbic acid to a quart of cold syrup. Leave 1/4 inch headspace, seal and freeze.

To make syrup, dissolve sugar in hot or cold water. You can mix it up the day before and keep it cold in the refrigerator. Use the following proportions:  
30% syrup—2 cups sugar, 4 cups water  
35%—2 1/2 cups sugar, 4 cups water  
40% syrup—3 cups sugar, 4 cups water

**Freezing Apples**

Sliced frozen apples are handy for pie making. Select full-flavored apples that are crisp and firm. Don't use mealy-textured ones. Wash, peel, and core. Cut 12 slices from a medium-size apple and 16 from a large one.

To prevent darkening, slice apples into a solution of 2 tablespoons salt to a gallon of water. Hold in this solution no more than 15 to 20 minutes. Drain. Over each quart of apple slices, sprinkle 1/4 cup sugar, and stir. Or you can omit the sugar. Pack apples into containers and press fruit down tightly. Leave 1/4 headspace, seal and freeze.

**Fishing Report**

Barkley: black bass fair on spinner baits and artificial nightcrawlers in inlets and bays around buck brush; crappie fair over channel drop offs in 12-15 feet of water; in tailwaters, catfish fair clear to murky, stable at one foot below pool and 81 degrees.

Rough River: Bluegill fair off shallow banks; crappie slow over submerged cover; white bass fair in the jumps in North Fork; clear, stable at pool and 83 degrees.

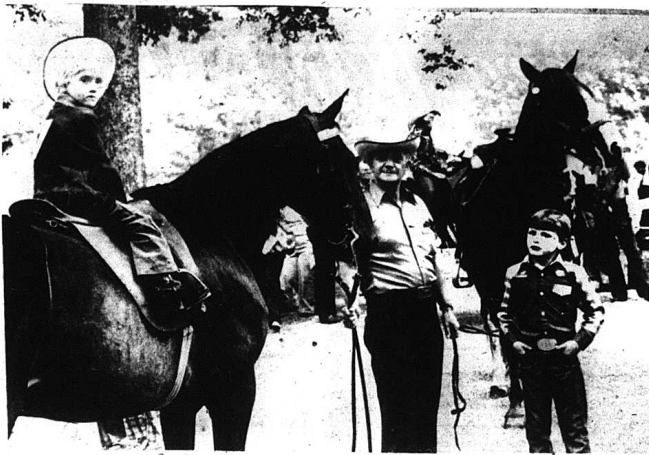
