#### City Council Votes To Purchase Main Street Property For Parking Lot

At Monday night's public hearing held by the Mt. Vernon City Council, the Council agreed to take the necessary steps prepartory to purchasing the old Ideal Cafe property on Main

Stree.

Several people present at the hearing, including incoming councilmen, expressed their approval of the project which would include tearing down the building presently located on the 30x26x150 ft. deep site and grading the site to be used for

the 30x26x150 ft. deep site and grading the site to be used for public parking.

The building is presently owned by R.A. Baker and, according to Mayor Mullins, Mr. Baker has agreed to sell the building for \$15,000. Of course, this figure is dependent on a HMD appraisal and a local apprasal. There is also an environmental assessment survey needed which the city will have to procure since HUDfunds are being used to purchase the property. The money which would be used for the purchase are some the City received from the sale of property behind city hall to R.A. Williams, developer of the elderly housing site now under construction.

Mayor Mullins expressed to Mayor Mullins expressed to the council his desire to perhaps resell the property to a private business or individual which would enable the city to keep the-property on its tax rolls.

In other business, Mayor Mullins took a moment to express his regret at losing four of the incumbent councilmen when their term of office expires this year.

The four councilmen are Elmer Alcorn, Oscar Bullock Chester Hellard and Joe Young Mr. Alcorn and Mr. Bullock were defeated in the November

were defeated in the November General Election and Mr. Hel-'lard and Mr. Young chose not to run for their positions again. Mayor Mullins spoke of the men's efforts on behalf of the community and their unselfish devotion to the largest of the

Mayor Mullins spoke of the men's efforts on behalf of the community and their unselfish devotion to the interests of the citizens of Mt. Vernon. Calling them outstanding councilmen, Mayor Mullins listed a few of the projects which have been undertaken during their tenure and told the four incoming councilmen present that they were to be commended for being willing to step out and take the leadership and do what needed to be done for the city.
